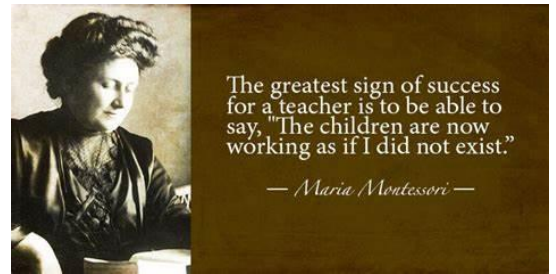
## Other Upcoming News & Events

### Upcoming Montessori Professional Development

I am thrilled to announce the American Montessori Society (AMS) is holding its annual conference in Boston this year! This 3-day conference provides Montessorians with quality professional development workshops and typically hosts approximately 3,000 attendees. This year, Ms. Laura, Ms. Anselmo, and I will attend the conference beginning on the evening of March 16th. We plan to share our experiences with the rest of the teaching teams at our next staff meeting. A reminder that **Friday, March 17th** is a Professional Development Day and there is no school/no extended day program.

### Think Ahead about Sunrise's Summer Program and Save the Dates!

Families have been inquiring about our Summer Program. This year we have 4 weeks scheduled. You may choose either the 5 morning or 5 full day option and you sign up is flexible, either week to week or for all 4 weeks. Ms. Laura will lead the summer program along with Ms. Jessica as her assistant teacher. The weeks are as follows:

- **Week 1 - June 19-20**
- **Week 2 - June 26-30**
- **Week 3 - July 10-14**
- **Week 4 - July 17-21**

There is no summer program during the week of July 3-7 due to the holiday.

During the summer schedule, Sunrise does not offer the before or aftercare extended day program.

Sunrise's Summer Program is open **only** to current students and accepted students for the 2023-2024 school year. This format fosters a relaxed and cohesive group as the children already know each other while getting to meet a few new friends. The weekly themes, rates, and details for signing up will be provided in a separate flyer in March.

## Extended Day – Afterschool February Fun - Rainbow Paper Experiment

The afterschool students participated in an outdoor lesson on how to make rainbow paper. First, they watched Ms. Jessica add a couple of drops of clear nail polish to a small bowl of water.

Then after a few seconds, Ms. Jessica dipped her paper heart (cut out of black construction paper) and set it aside to dry. This process is called “thin film interference”.

Thin film interference occurs when light waves reflecting off the top and bottom surfaces of a thin film interfere with one another. Each child had the opportunity to make their own rainbow paper as pictured.

Thank you, Ms. Jessica and Ms. Samantha, for making afterschool fun!



## Drop off and Pick up Schedule

To ensure your child is receiving the fullest our program has to offer, your child should arrive at school on time each day. Drop off is from 8:30-8:45am. When your child arrives late, they may miss an important part of the morning schedule – Group/Circle time (around 8:50am in both rooms).

Pick up time for the half day students is from 11:30-11:40am and for the full day students it is from 2:30-2:40pm. If you arrive late for your scheduled pick-up time, it may affect your child’s routine. Please be courteous and mindful of the scheduled drop off and pick up times – thank you!

## Driveway Safety

As you know, we share driveway entrances and exits with the other Moseley Complex businesses. To help keep the car line moving efficiently and safely during drop off times, the staff will take your child from your car for you (you do not even need to get out of the car during the drop off time). Please do not allow your child to let themselves out of the car. A staff member or an adult must accompany the children to the school. If you prefer to walk your child to the school entrance, please park in the parking lot and walk with your child down to the entrance.

## Playground Update and Reminder

You may have noticed newly added woodchips and fresh sand have been added to the outdoor playground space over the February break. We are fortunate to have a playground area that offers a variety of shade, sun, sand, and a hill to enjoy! However, every playground has its challenges during the changing seasons. The recent mixed weather brings soft ground, some icy spots, and sometimes mud along the fence line on parts of the playground. The children love playing outside together, and we make every attempt to be outdoors. This means packing/wearing waterproof boots, appropriate jackets, and hats daily. Also, please be prepared that your child's clothing may get dirty while playing outdoors. Although muddy or wet outdoor gear may seem like an inconvenience for parents and caregivers at pick up times, movement and exercise is an essential part of the children's outdoor play and development. ## Classroom A Newsletter February 2023

Dear Classroom A Families,

The month of February in our classroom was filled with many celebrations and learning about how we can spread kindness and love! Our classroom also celebrated Valentine's Day together and had a wonderful valentine exchange! We read books about friendship and kindness in celebration of Valentine's Day, and we practiced cutting valentine hearts in the art area. We worked with coloring, pin punching, and completing heart themed **Practical Life** during the month. Examples included hanging hearts with clothespins, sifting with colored rice, opening/closing heart shaped containers, and transferring colored hearts using tongs and spoons!

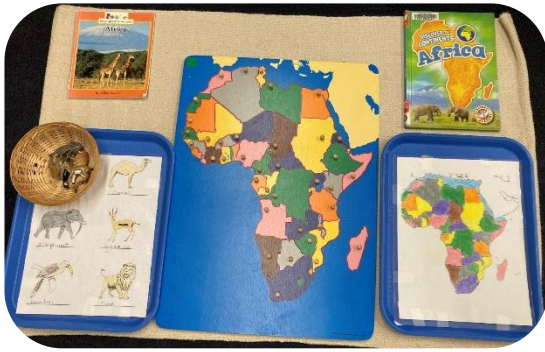
Our **Artist Study** this month was Wassily Kandinsky and we read *The Noisy Paint Box: The Colors and Sounds of Kandinsky's Abstract Art* by Barb Rosenstock. The class learned about the secondary colors purple, green, and orange that are created by mixing the primary colors red, blue, and yellow. After learning about Kandinsky's "Squares with Concentric Circles," the children painted their own version for Valentine's Day using concentric hearts!



This month in **Science**, our class has been learning about mammals! On Groundhog's Day, we had a fun time coloring, cutting and gluing to create a fun groundhog pop-up project! The children enjoyed reading *About Mammals* by Cathryn and John Sill and discovered how mammals have fur or hair, are born alive, and that mammal mothers produce milk to feed their babies! The children worked on labeling the parts of the groundhog and completing the parts of the horse 3-part matching work.



In **Geography**, our classroom has just begun the Africa continent study! We started reading the continent book about Africa and will learn about the land and water forms of the continent, the people and animals who live there, and many fun facts about food, music, culture, and climate!



We are excited to begin this continent study together and invite families who have ever traveled there or have something they'd like to share with the class to reach out to us! We would love to include Classroom A parents / family community as we learn about the continent of Africa!

During **Kindergarten Afternoon**, the Kindergarteners have been working on building and writing CVC words using the movable alphabet! In celebration of Valentine's Day, we sorted CVC words with the "cookie jar" middle sounds. The Kindergarteners sorted the pictures by identifying vowel sounds, then wrote the words. They also learned about the penguin life cycle!



Early in the month, around Groundhog's Day, we learned about shadows and how shadows are created whenever there is sunlight. We had the opportunity to get outside on an unusually warm February afternoon and the Kindergarteners enjoyed creating their own shadow chalk art!



We would like to wish a very Happy Birthday to Brady, who celebrated his birthday this month!

Just as a reminder, if it is not raining or too cold, our class goes outside as much as we can during play time. Please make sure your child has appropriate boots for the occasional muddy conditions of the playground so everyone stays dry and comfortable for the duration of the play time!

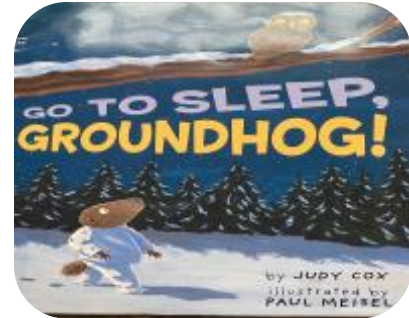




Hello Classroom B Parents,

Our **Artist** of the month was Georges Seurat. We learned that he was an impressionist and was known for pointillism. Part of our art project for this month was teaching the children how to create a drawing using pointillism. We incorporated this into our Valentines art project. The children loved this art lesson. The children had a great time celebrating and making their Valentine’s Day boxes. We enjoyed many stories throughout the month on kindness, friendships, manners and love. It was an exciting day for all.



In the **Geography/Cultural curriculum** our class has moved onto the next continent, Africa.

**Kindergarten Corner:** In Kindergarten the children continue to work on their reading, writing and comprehension skills. We went on a nature walk and then surprised the children with some creative shadow chalk art. They had a great time tracing the outlines of their shadows. It was such a beautiful day.
