Many use the swipe of an iPhone app. We took in over \$2,000 on credit card sales during the afternoon show plus the cash sales.

The first weekend in March was the TALOH Annual Meeting in Fredericksburg Texas. Outgoing TALOH Commander Bill Chicky had a great banquet at the Inn on Barons Creek. The Necrology Service was held in the Admiral Nimitz Museum. Attending this service should be on every Navy sailor's bucket list as it is dedicated to the men who served for Admiral Bull Nimitz. There are plaques honoring these men on the wall around three sides of the city lot where the museum is. It is next door to the National Museum of the Pacific War. It requires over four hours to take it all in. In Texas, these two museums, three Presidential Libraries, and two Shrine Hospitals for Children have been on my bucket list. President Lyndon B. Johnson's boyhood home and Texas White House were on my way home. I took in the LBJ Texas White House and the ranch where his little Air Force One plane is also available for tour. I tried to make it over to Austin for his library however I arrived just five minutes before closing time. I will have to arrange time to see the two Bush libraries next year while at the TALOH Convention. It will be in Fredericksburg again.

Kansas Grand Lodge of Ancient Free and Accepted Masons was held on March 17 through 19 at the Capitol Plaza Hotel in Topeka just five blocks south of the Capital. There were several items of Bylaws changes to be taken up. The one that caught everyone's eye is an increase of per capita dues which was voted down. On the program was former Senator Bob Dole who is a masonic member of the Russell, Kansas Lodge. He was unable to make it; however he sent a \$500,000 check for the Kansas Masonic Foundation, a 501c3 nonprofit organization that was started 50 years ago in the 1966 annual communication. Among its accomplishments are the SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM, with over 300 annual scholarships; MATCHING FUNDS PROGRAM, which supports community programs; FREEMASON ENDOWMENT, to help Masons and families in need; KANSAS UNIVERSITY CANCER RESEARCH, which to date has raised more than \$25 million for KU Cancer Research; YOUTH PROGRAMS, which funds strategic youth groups such as Rainbow Girls, Job's Daughters and DeMolay to enable them to launch programs that further their missions.

I have had the pleasure of being assigned the last two years to DIVISION THREE / TWO and getting acquainted with their Legion of Honor members, Shriners and the Northeast Shrine Association. This area starts at the west side of New York and all states east of NY to the Atlantic Ocean. It also includes Quebec, New Brunswick, Nova Scotia, and Newfoundland in Canada. Thanks to the five LOH Units who worked with me to get their Annual Reports up to date and turned into the International Adjutant Kevin Fox.


