I Am the Light of the World

(Second Sunday in Lent)

When we walk in the darkness, the way is not clear to us. We stumble about, placing ourselves in danger unaware. On the other hand, when we walk in the light our way is clear. We are able to see the pitfalls and avoid them, moving with assurance toward our goal. Jesus said, "I am the light of the world." He is a sure beacon by which to guide our lives and our interactions with others.

Light brings out the beauty in us. Dinner by candlelight makes each person around the table seem radiant with their natural, inner beauty. But, light makes evident our unloveliness as well. Our imperfections cannot be hidden in the light. Such things as our anger or harshness or jealousy or selfishness are there for all to see.

Often, we Christians view the light as being too ideal, too much for us to accomplish. We stray from the light into the darkness because the light requires too much of us. It has a way of making us uncomfortable at times, and it often clashes with what we prefer to do.

Through the centuries, well-meaning Christians have strayed from the path into the darkness. Wars have been waged in the name of God. Villages have been plundered and destroyed in the name of the church. Some persons have been enslaved. Rights have been denied to others.

Jesus said, "I am the light of the world." He did not come to support tradition. He did not come to justify our misconceptions about God. He did not come to judge us for our shortcomings. He came to bring light into the world. If we keep our eyes steadfastly fastened upon Jesus and his teaching, the way will be clear. He does not promise us the way will be easy; in fact, he warns us that it is just the opposite. But, as rocky and difficult as it may become at times, with Jesus lighting the way, we can and will be builders of the kingdom.

Another aspect of this theme focuses upon light as a form of energy, calling us into accountability as good stewards of our resources. Are we free to be irresponsible with the light provided upon earth? As the world faces the certainty of diminishing energy sources, will we truly see ourselves plunged into darkness because of poor stewardship? What can we as Christians do about this?
