



BUMC FINANCE - INFORMATIONAL STEWARDSHIP/GIVING PURPOSE GUIDE!

Unsure about which purpose code to use when giving donations over and above your regular tithe? This guide is to assist you and help make sure your donation goes where you want it to be used. (Some numbers are skipped as they are used for accounting purposes.) In addition, we hope it provides valuable information about how BUMC Finance works.

First – our budget operates with two account TYPES. They are BUDGETED and DESIGNATED. EVERYTHING WE DO FALLS INTO ONE OF THESE TYPES.

BUDGETED: ALL BUDGETED items come from the General Offering. Usually, no budgeted items appear in a donation list. However, since sometimes the budgeted amount falls short of being able to fully fund the ministry – we continue to accept donations to augment what has been budgeted.

DESIGNATED: Designated ministries are NOT funded by the budget and rely entirely on donations to function. These are always "over and above your tithe" type donations. If no monies are available, then these purposes cannot be accomplished. This is not to say that exceptions are not made on occasion – but it is NOT a good stewardship practice, and we should all want it to be avoided!

Our stewardship accounting operates with a Number and Fund name designating where it should be posted. Please clearly write BOTH on your envelope. IF THE PURPOSE IS UNCLEAR, FUNDS DEFAULT TO THE GEN-ERAL OFFERING. This is important to know. We ALWAYS defer to CLEAR instructions from the Giver. However, our accounting system posts all offering envelopes in a deposit as a "batch". One envelope NOT clearly designated, delays posting of the entire batch. Therefore, the giver is responsible for assuring their envelopes are marked clearly and correctly. Below in blue are both the number and the name of the purpose. The envelopes are small so, if necessary, you can add a note with your instructions in the envelope with your gift.

1. General Offering – this is a BUDGETED category for tithes and offerings given to sustain the overall operations of the Church and its missions. It is the category that keeps the church alive and functioning. It provides for salaries, maintenance of the facilities, necessary supplies, necessary services (like electricity) and funds the ministries adopted by the church to be part of its ongoing outreach. This category is indeed the lifeblood of BUMC. Therefore, we stress that additional donations should be over and above what you tithe. For any of the things below to happen this fund must be healthy!

4. Food Pantry – this is a BUDGETED ministry of the church. Just like its name implies – this is a ministry that provides food to those in need. Donations to assist with funding this ministry can be made to augment what has been budgeted.

5. Seasonal Flowers – this is a DESIGNATED category, and goes to pay for flowers for special seasons of the church such as Easter, Christmas, Mother's Day, etc. This is NOT the category to use for regular weekly sanctuary flowers. That one is below.

7. Walk to Emmaus – this is a DESIGNATED fund. This is a discipleship retreat for Christian growth which occurs annually. Many members have attended and highly regard this opportunity. The monies given to this fund are used to provide scholarships for those who might wish to go on this walk but need some financial assistance with the cost. (If you or anyone you know desires to participate but the cost is prohibitive, please call the church office for more information.)

9. Open Table- this is a BUDGETED fund. This category has also been called Fresh Expressions. Having two names for the same fund caused a little bit of confusion, so we have settled on the title of "Open Table" for this ministry. It is one of those we spoke about which still accepts donations to augment what has been budg-eted. This fund is used to help our weekly feeding program which offers meals to the community and church members as well, at no cost.

10. UMCOR – this is a DESIGNATED fund and represents the disaster relief fund sponsored by the United Methodist Conference. It is generally activated to aid victims of a natural disaster wherever they are needed. All monies collected are paid into the national Methodist UMCOR account for disbursement by the conference.

12. Children's Home – this is a DESIGNATED fund. As a Methodist church we participate in the funding of the Children's Home sponsored by the Methodist Conference. This is where our 5th Sunday extra offering goes. While we designate a special time for this offering – this category is open for donations at any time.

13. Missions/Love Fund – this is a DESIGNATED fund. This category is two that we have combined to make them more effective for the present. In the past, the Missions category was used to help with foreign missionaries/missions' support. Currently, the church is not supporting foreign missions. The Love Fund/Uplifting Grace – was created to financially assist members of our community as well as members of our church family who encounter financial hardship. Since we view this as a mission, it was concluded and approved that the two funds could be combined and named the Missions/Love Fund. This fund can cover a broad range of instances where people need temporary help. Good stewardship requires that funds requested are approved by our Finance Committee. Use of these funds may range from helping a family whose home burned down – to helping with an unexpected car repair which could prevent a family wage earner from going to work. The key to this category is it seeks to assist with temporary needs that will eventually resolve. (We know Foreign missions are also important so it should be noted that if we take on that role in the future – this category can again be split.)

16. United Methodist Women – this is a DESIGNATED fund. This category is to help fund the special projects the women of the church have elected to support. Most of them deal with aid for Women and Children. In addition to providing extra support for the Children's Home – they support The Madison Youth Ranch, The Sherriff's Youth Ranch, Shepherd's Lighthouse and Hands Of Mercy Everywhere (HOME) which assists unwed mothers. This fund includes monies collected for the Women's Retreat. They do various fundraising events and the funds raised from these events is placed into this category.

18. Special Seasonal Events – this is a DESIGNATED fund. As a church we have historically sponsored many seasonal Community Events. This category funds those events. For example, the Easter Egg Hunt, the 4th of July celebration, Fall Festival, etc. These funds are used for the most current event. Unused monies remaining after the event occurs simply roll over to the next occasion. The money you give will never sit idle because it was not used for a particular event. Win-win!

20. Sanctuary Flowers – this is a DESIGNATED fund. The beautiful flowers that are in our sanctuary on a regular weekly basis come from this fund. If you are signed up to provide flowers for the church on a particular week, the money you give to pay for those flowers should be designated to this purpose.

21. Methodist Men – this is a DESIGNATED fund. Much like category 16, this fund specializes in supporting the ministries the men of the church have elected to support such as the Society of St. Andrews. (The Society works to bring healthy foods to the hungry.)

22. J.O.Y – this is a DESIGNATED fund. This fund helps us fellowship as a church! Dinner on the grounds, ice cream social, BBQ's and things of this type. While all are welcome – these events are specifically designed for church members to spend time together. Many items are furnished by members of the congregation, but for those that are not – funds from this account can be used. In addition – this fund functions like the Seasonal Events. Any monies remaining after the current event takes place, roll over and can be used for the next one!

Still have questions? We're here to help! Just call the church office and request a call back from the Finance Dept. We'll reach out and do our best to provide answers! God loves a cheerful giver and we do too! Thanks so much for your support!

If you are giving in addition to your regular tithes and offerings – (items 4-22) please write both the name and number of the purpose along with the amount you want to go to that category. We know the envelopes are small – so, if necessary, you can include a note and place it in your envelope with your gift. There are currently no other valid designations. New "Funds" can only be opened with presentation to the Finance Committee for approval.


