He said: while I'm no expert, nor do I claim to be perfect, my experience in working these steps in order is that each one seems to have a funny way of getting me ready for the next. With that said, having truly worked Steps 1 & 2 to the best of my ability, along with the help from another who'd been here before, I felt ready to climb to the next level, or step.

I'm not trying to instill any fear, but if you thought 2 was tuff you better hang on to your hat. Not only have you been challenged to believe in a power greater than yourself (Step 2) now it suggested to turn your WILL and your LIFE over to the care of a God of your understanding. Don't worry it's not church and when we say God what we really mean is your higher power. You'll see the word God used a lot and my experience is it's an acronym for Higher Power, a power greater than myself, more easily said as 'G'ood 'O'rderly 'D'irection.

Even though some of the literature says this is an action step I myself see no action in making a decision. And that's all it is. You have already admitted you have a disease and that you are not in charge of, or can handle, your own life. Hopefully you believe in a Power greater than yourself. I mean how else could you be here doing this? My own will always kept me away from this place, so, this one should be easy.

How is this done you say? Well I thought you'd never ask! Simple, just keep coming to meetings, hang out with people like you, aka us drunks, don't drink between meetings and ask for help. That's it. That's my experience and that's all there is to it. Oh yea, it helps a lot if you pray, that's not hard either. Just close your eyes and ask for help. Read the book and *(Cont. p. 2)*

She said: In short: "Thy will be done". That meant getting out of the way; to stop trying to play the director in my life and everyone else's lives around me. Forcing my will is an act of selfish and self-centered fear- based action that never turned out well for me, ever.

I truly did not understand, when I first crawled into AA, what the Big Book spoke about on pg 62, where it states "So our troubles, we think, are basically of our own making". WHAT? Why in the world would I put myself into all of the messes that I found myself in?!? I have learned it's not because I set out with the intention of screwing up my life. I did it with the actions that were born out of fear and self will. When I became willing to be honest, "I" was the common denominator in ALL my affairs. Ironically alcohol was not. I was.

Now that I have this new found knowledge, that I created this mess, what can I do about it? I can become willing to make a decision to let God be the one to run my show. There were a myriad of emotions running through my mind. First, I was actually relieved to know that I don't have to figure this out all on my own. I also wanted to cling to the illusion of control. Though it had never worked for me in the past, my ego was afraid to let go. I felt comforted that I could turn my will over to my higher power, but my life? My whole life? Seriously, everything in my life? YES! For my higher power permeates my entire life, every aspect, every nook and cranny. Finally, there was willingness to try something different. I saw demonstrations of changed lives because of this NEW way of living. A different way to live? Wasn't that what I was here for? YES! I also kept hearing over and over... "If you (Cont. p. 2)

I'm not in any way telling anyone what to do. These are all suggestions. But, if you're anything like me, and I'll bet we have more in common than you think, it was 'do or die.' It was at that point where I was able to see some light. Right at that point it was just a twinkle, but I saw it. I wasn't in jail, I wasn't in a hospital on life support nor was I dead. There had to be some truth to this stuff. I'm feeling tired, I want to rest, here are the keys you drive, I think I'm there... I'm willing to turn my will and my life over to The Care of a God of my understanding.

Jan. 2 1896: Born in Brooklyn, Dr. Harry Tiebout. He would become the first psychiatrist to publicly recognize and uphold the work of A.A.

Jan. 1914: Ebby T. took his first drink of alcohol, 19 years old at the Hotel Ten-Eyck, Albany, New York. He will become Bill W.'s one and only sponsor.

Jan., 1920: Alcohol Prohibition begins in the United States.

Jan. 1933: Harvey Firestone (Firestone Tires) sponsors a week-long event for the Oxford Group in Akron. This is where Henrietta Seiberling would join the movement.

Jan. 2, 1938: The first sale of "Works Publishing" Co." stock is recorded, which would become the 'seed' money for writing of the Big Book.

Jan. 8, 1939: Richmond Walker, author of "The 24 Hrs A Day Book" joined the Oxford Group. 50 yrs old and 30 years of heavy un-controlled drinking under his belt.

Jan 1940: The first A.A Meeting not in a home begins at King School, Akron, Ohio. This was Dr. Bob's home group.

Jan. 1949: The first "Anonymity Letter" went out from G.S.O. to the media, thanking them for their 'friendly support and cooperation.

Jan. 1955: A.A. is brought to India by Harry M., businessman from England.

Jan. 30, 1961: Dr. Carl Jung responds to Bill's letter by pointing out the connection between alcoholism and the spiritual search.

Jan. 1979: The two millionth copy of the Big Book presented to H.E.W. Secretary Joseph Califano in a ceremony at G.S.O.

"Our membership ought to include all who suffer from alcoholism. Hence we may refuse none who wishes to recover. Nor ought A.A. membership ever depend upon money or conformity. Any two or three alcoholics gathered together for sobriety may call themselves an A.A. group, provided that, as a group, they have no other affiliation."

No matter who you are, no matter how low you have gone, even if you have grave emotional and mental disorders, even if you have a criminal resume, etc;......we still can't deny you A.A. We don't want to keep you out. We want you to have the same opportunity to recover that we have had.

How fortunate we are that there are no membership rules. No pledges to sign, no uniforms to be worn. We don't have to drink the "Kool Aid" or even learn to pray "the right way". When we say to ourselves that we are willing to be a part of AA, then we are. How cool is that? I for one am grateful that I was welcomed to come to meetings and no one pressured me to join the group. They only asked "Do you think you have a problem with alcohol?", and when I said "Yes". The response from the person at the door was "Welcome to the Open Door Fellowship of AA" "Would you like a cup of coffee?" After that I was welcomed every time I showed up at a meeting.

I am one of those people who had to be shown, through the Steps and the Traditions, how the Spiritual Principles are important in Recovery from my behavior, one day at a time. Thank God that I did not have to conform to any rules of decorum, or speak proper English, or not use cuss words when I first arrived at the doorsteps of AA. I may have had to leave, sometimes the best that I could do was to drop Fbombs when I shared, because I was so mad.

As the days turned into weeks, then months, then years... I have come to a place where my behavior outside of the meetings of AA matches my actions inside of the meetings. I have come to a place in sobriety where I have the ability to welcome anyone into AA that wishes to be free from the hell of active alcoholism. But I am aware that not all who enter the rooms are going to stay for the long haul. But that is not my business. That's Gods business. My job is to place myself in a position to be of maximum service to God and the people about me, PERIOD.
