Knowing that one day


You will search your heart



BY-LAW CHANGES 2021

SPECIAL COMMITTEES: 1ST READING OF THE BY-LAW CHANGES AND THEY READ AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 2.1 AS READS: THE ANNUAL NOMINATIONS, ELECTION AND INSTALLATION OF OFFICERS SHALL BE AS PROVIDED IN SECTIONS 91.1 TO 91.7 STATUTES F.O.E OR LAWS AMENDATORY THEREOF. THIS EXCLUDES SECTION 91.1 (A) AND (B) UNLESS SPECIFICALLY APPROVED IN THE AERIE BY-LAWS. VACANCIES IN OFFICE SHALL BE FILLED AS PROVIDED IN SECTION 92.92.1 STATUTES, F.O.E OR LAWS AMENDATORY THERE OF.

SECTION 2.1 AMENDED TO READ: THE ANNUAL NOMINATIONS, ELECTION AND INSTALLATION OF OFFICERS SHALL BE AS PROVIDED IN SECTIONS 91.1 TO 91.7 STATUTES F.O.E OR LAWS AMENDATORY THEREOF. THIS EXCLUDES SECTION 91.1 (A) AND (B) UNLESS SPECIFICALLY APPROVED IN THE AERIE BY-LAWS. VACANCIES IN OFFICE SHALL BE FILLED AS PROVIDED IN SECTION 92.92.1 STATUTES, F.O.E OR LAWS AMENDATORY THERE OF.

(a) A CANDIDATE FOR THE OFFICE OF WORTHY PRESIDENT MUST HAVE SERVED AS AN OFFICER FOR TWO YEARS AND A MEMBER OF AERIE 4272 FOR TWO YEARS.

(b) A CANDIDATE FOR THE OFFICE OF VICE-PRESIDENT MUST HAVE SERVED AS AN OFFICER FOR ONE YEAR AND A MEMBER OF AERIE 4272 FOR TWO YEARS.

(c) A CANDIDATE FOR THE OFFICE OF SECRETARY MUST HAVE BEEN AN OFFICER FOR ONE YEAR AND A MEMBER OF AERIE 4272 FOR TWO YEARS.

(d) A CANDIDATE FOR THE OFFICE OF TRUSTEE MUST HAVE BEEN A MEMBER OF AERIE 4272 FOR TWO YEARS.

SECTION 3.7 (C) AS READS: "GOLDEN AGE EAGLES" WILL PAY ONLY APPLICATION PER CAPITA TAXES.

SECTION 3.7 (C) AMENDED TO READ: DELETE AMENDED TO ADD SECTION 3.8 "GOLDEN AGE EAGLES" AND "LIFE MEMBER EAGLES" SHALL NOT PAY PER CAPITA TAXES.

SECTION 9.3 AS READS: FOR THE FAITHFUL PERFORMANCE OF THE SECRETARIAL DUTIES, THE SECRETARY SHALL RECEIVE PER CAPITA COMPENSATION, PAYABLE MONTHLY, BASED ON THE NUMBER OF MEMBERS IN GOOD STANDING AND WHO ARE NOT MORE THAN ONE MONTH IN ARREARS AS FOLLOWS: \$1.25 CENTS PER MONTH PER MEMBER.

SECTION 9.3 AMENDED TO READ: FOR THE FAITHFUL PERFORMANCE OF THE SECRETARIAL DUTIES, THE SECRETARY SHALL RECEIVE PER CAPITA COMPENSATION, PAYABLE MONTHLY, BASED ON THE NUMBER OF MEMBERS IN GOOD STANDING AND WHO ARE NOT MORE THAN ONE MONTH IN ARREARS AS FOLLOWS: \$1.75 ONE DOLLAR SEVENTY FIVE CENTS PER MONTH PER MEMBER. PROPOSED AT REGULAR MEETING HELD THE 25TH DAY OF MARCH 2021

SECOND READING AT REGULAR MEETING HELD THE 8TH DAY OF APRIL, 2021

ADOPTED AT REGULAR MEETING HELD THE 22ND DAY OF APRIL 2021.






