THEME: This is a Rogues themed show. "The Zodiac." is a theme that aims to be compelling to our audience and broad enough so that most of us can fit our work into it. Below is how it can break down to fit our needs. **We are including the Tarot and the Chinese Zodiac. You do not need to limit yourself to these suggestions:**

The Zodiac

1. Virgo – Young woman, wheat, agriculture
2. Leo – strength, lions
3. Gemini - duality, twins
4. Pisces – fishes, romance
5. Taurus – Bulls, stubbornness
6. Scorpio – scorpions, protector of animals
7. Libra – scales, justice
8. Aries – Rams, war, battle
9. Aquarius – Pouring water, carrying water, floods, rivers
10. Capricorn – Goats, forests and woodlands, flocks & shepherds
11. Sagittarius – travel, archers/ archery, centaurs
12. Cancer – Birth and nurturing

Titles of works should state the sign the work represents plus any other subtitle you wish, i.e. "Gemini: Twin Oak Trees."

AWARDS: Ribbons for Best of, First, Second and Third Place plus 2 honorable mentions will be awarded at the reception. Cash awards of \$100, \$75, \$50, \$25 respectively, and merchandise certificates courtesy of Richeson, in the amount of \$75.00 will be awarded for each place winner. Ribbons only for honorable mentions. **For this show, you may submit work that has previously won an award at a Rogues show.**

JUROR/JUDGE: Jon Wos

ELIGIBILITY & RESTRICTIONS: Open to all Rogues Artists Group members in good standing. Sculpture, artists' books, assemblage, photography, metalwork, and collage are all welcomed. **Submit as many pieces as you like. Up to 70 pieces are needed!** Work submitted should not have been shown at the Richeson School & Gallery previously. Work submitted must be original. Work must have been created in the past 2 years. Compositions from published material, other artist's work, or from photographs not taken by the artist are not considered original works. Artwork exhibited must be appropriate for viewing by all ages of the general public. Artwork that is overtly sexual, racist, violent, libelous, slanderous, demoralizing or discriminatory in nature is strictly prohibited.

SPECIFICATIONS: All artwork must have an identification label attached to the back. Label must include: artist's name, email address, phone number, work title, medium and price.

2-D art must be suitably framed and wired for hanging on a hanging system. NO clips or saw-tooth hangers! **Artists will be charged a wiring fee of \$20 per artwork if artists are not able to provide the appropriate wiring accessories!** Art including frame must not exceed 60" on any side and may not exceed 50 lbs. Gallery-wrapped canvases and cradled panels must have a depth of 2", all edges must be finished and work must comply with hanging specifications listed above. No protruding nails or staples can be visible on the canvas sides. Works on paper must be framed and glazed.

3-D work must not exceed a footprint of 12" x 12" vertical height limited to 6 feet and may not weigh more than 50 lbs. 3-D work is restricted to its own pedestal or stand on which it will be displayed. **No pedestals will be provided so bring or borrow your own pedestal!** No component of the sculpture may be adhered or attached to the walls or flooring in any way. This includes but its not limited to screwing, nailing gluing or taping.

ARTISTS STATEMENTS: In lieu of statements on the label, we may put together a binder with artists' information and the statement that goes with each piece.

RECEPTION: Richeson School of Art and Gallery will provide food and beverages including wine for the reception. (The food they provide has always been fabulous!) The Krazy Katz will be providing live music

COMMISSION: Artwork does NOT need to be for sale. NFS allowed. Richeson School & Gallery will receive a commission of 25% on all sales as a result of the exhibit. Richeson School of Art & Gallery will make every effort to encourage sales of work from this exhibition. Payment for sales will be mailed to the artist within 30 days of closing. Artwork must remain on site until the final date of the exhibit.

DELIVERY & PACKAGING: Drop off all artwork at the Richeson School & Gallery. There will be several vehicles making the hour and 30-minute journey. If you are going, please volunteer to deliver for a few of your fellow Rogues. We will be collecting names of those who CANNOT make the journey and need their work delivered.

Make sure your work is properly packaged, and your name is on the packaging, especially if someone else is delivering for you. Drivers will not be responsible for damage to others work if it has not been properly packaged and may refuse to deliver work at their discretion.

Shipped work must be sent in a reusable container. The artist is responsible for the cost of shipping to and from Richeson School of Art and Gallery. Pre-paid labels or a credit card number for return shipping must be included in the shipping container with the artwork.

AGREEMENT: Submission of work indicates acceptance of all conditions set forth here. By entering work in this exhibition, the artist gives Richeson School of art & Gallery the right to use images for the 2023 "The Zodiac" exhibition digital, print and web promotions. Send images intended for publicity to rogue1gallery@gmail.com. Images should be at least 1M jpgs labeled: Last name, first initial, underscore, title.
