Only ten of the 57 original members owned rifles, and only six owned handguns! At the time, they were using the upstairs area in the Midland Grange building as a range. Mark is planning on framing the document and hanging it in the new clubhouse.

The State high power rifle matches will be held June 3rd and 4th. Saturday's matches will be 200 and 300 yard matches, with Sunday's matches being at 600 yards. NRA BASICS OF PERSONAL PROTECTION OUTSIDE THE HOME COURSE

The Paul Bunyan Rifle & Sportsman's Club will host an NRA Basics of Personal Protection Outside the Home Course July 29th-30th, and August 5th. The course will be taught by NRA Certified Instructors and will cover the basics of concealed handgun carry. Participants will learn basic defensive handgun carry modes, concealment techniques, presentation from concealment, special shooting techniques, firearms and the law, and more. This course consists of three mandatory sessions from 9 AM – 4:30 PM each day. Advance registration and deposit of course fee (\$50) is required. Membership in Paul Bunyan R&S Club and/or the NRA is not required in order to attend this course.

This is an intermediate level course; participants must be experienced shooters.

COURSE PREREQUISITE: Completion of the NRA Basics of Personal Protection In The Home course, or equivalent experience (instructor permission required).

In addition, **all** participants must pass a pre-course evaluation. The evaluation will take place Saturday July 8th.

We held our outdoor match, the Phyllis Cline memorial match, April 29th. We had 38 shooters compete in the 60 shot match. We did get a bit of rain toward the end of the match but were able to finish it. Alec Patajo won the prone match, and Kellen McAferty of Olympia won the 3 position match. The state smallbore championship match was held in Wenatchee May 13th, with Alec Patajo winning both days. The team we sent over came in second out of 8 teams participating. The air rifle match was held May 12th, with Alec Patajo coming in 3rd by 3/10 of a point. In addition, he made history by earning the Launi Meili Perpetual award for the 4th time. The only competitor to do so (this perpetual has been in existence for 35 years). This award combines the state indoor 3 position, state outdoor 3 position and state prone championship combined aggregate score for the year. He also earned 3 more perpetual awards, state outdoor 3 position (3rd time), state outdoor prone (1st time) and combined state outdoor 3 position and prone (3rd time).

Doug made a motion at the general meeting asking the club to donate, as we have done in the past, \$300 toward her travel expenses. Motion was voted on and passed.

200 YD 22RF FUN MATCH

We just held (5/23) the first of a few unscheduled, informal play/fun matches for this summer. They will be conducted on some Tuesdays, and start at 9 am. The range is NOT closed to other members. It usually takes roughly an hour to do the whole thing.

These are simple matches consisting of a sighter string and two 10 round strings at 200 yards shot on the MR 52 target. Each string has a time limit of 15 minutes. Longer on the sighter target if you are having difficulty "finding paper". Any PBC member or their guests are eligible. The cost is \$1, One US dollar, for the match, with the winner taking the pot. If we have more than 7 entries, the 2nd place entry gets their buck back.

There is an additional match called the One-Shot, which, surprisingly enough, takes one shot to complete. This baby's shot on the red 200 yard ASSRA center. If you enter, it'll cost you another buck, with the same winning arrangement as the "big" one. The shot closest to center or highest score, wins.

Any .22 LR scoped rifle qualifies, no separate classes. For the really ambitious, scoped pistols are allowed as well. No .17 or 22 mags, please.
