OHP is a non-profit organization dedicated to improving the oral health of disadvantaged children and youth by providing free dental care for kids in and around Brown County. OHP does their mission in three fixed-site clinics, a traveling van for a schoolbased program and a hospital clinic team. OHP employs a full and part time staff of 11 dentists, 5 hygienists, and 13 dental assistants. Their success is measured in the confident smiles and the pain free teeth of their patients. During the past two years the annual average value of the dental service provided by OHP has been approximately \$6,000,000 measured by the cost of private dental care. We enjoyed an interesting program about a very worthwhile area dental project.
