#### **October 2013 Meeting Report**

For the first half of October, we've been blessed with beautiful weather for our various Pontiac activities. Starting with our meeting on the 1<sup>st</sup>, about 26 WMPOCI'ers showed up at Famous Dave's Restaurant for good food and catching up. President Doug Troost started the meeting out having Terri Miller give us her Treasurer's Report. Income consisted of dues, and expenditures of our September picnic and the two year renewal of our web site. Speaking of our web site, Doug passed out business cards to everyone present, which are to be given to Pontiac/GMC owners who might be interested in joining our club. It beats carrying and handing out 8.5x11 inch application sheets! The cards have our web site listed, as well as our meeting information on the back. Keep some in the glove box of your Pontiac. You never know when you'll need some of these cards to hand out!

Doug asked me to give a brief talk about the Pure Stock Drags. I really didn't know what I'd be able to tell you since most of you are there helping out. So I decided to talk about how the Pure Stocks got their start. I won't bore you with all the details again, but in a nutshell it all began way back in 1985 when the Buick GS Club of America invited all Brand X cars to take on their stock GS on the drag strip at their national convention. My brother Dennis took his '70 RAIV Judge, and I took my '71 455 H.O. T-37. I made it to the finals against the Buick club's '70 GS Stage One car, but I lost the race when I forgot to turn on the electric fuel pump (which is no longer on the car!). From this one event, musclecar races gained popularity. We went to a lot of them with our Pontiacs. However, as aftermarket companies bought sponsorships, the rules changed to allow modified cars to compete, eventually excluding our stock cars. So way back in the early 90's, fellow GTO racer and friend, Bob Boden, and I talked about starting our own race for stock musclecars. We rented Milan Dragway for 1993 and 1994 and maybe got 20 cars each year. For 1995, we switched to the Mid Michigan Motorplex in Stanton, and we've been there ever since. We grew from a 20-car, single-day event to 130 cars over three days! The race has been covered by magazines like Muscle Car Review, Muscle Car Enthusiast (now defunct), and Hemmings Muscle Machines. In the early days, Bob and I could handle the race by ourselves. But as we grew, we realized we needed help. As a member of the West Michigan Pontiac Club, I asked fellow members if they'd like to help out. Well, I didn't have to ask twice. Every year, the Pontiac Club, you, come out in numbers and have helped make this race the best one in the country! Bob has since retired, and his friend Lyndon Hughes, and my brother Dennis, have joined with me to head up the race. But it is you guys that have made the race run like clockwork and made it a hit with musclecar owners all over the country. Thanks so much for your help! And as I always say, we couldn't do it without you!

Scott Van Tamelen gave us an update on our October 12<sup>th</sup> color tour. Read more about it at the end of my report!

The November meeting is our Valve Cover Race, AND or officer elections! The meeting will be held at Ron and Elaine VanZytveld's house. So get your valve covers lubed up and ready!

So far, we have no entertainment reserved for our December Christmas Party. If you have any suggestions, please let us know.

Carl Thorwall told us the 2014 Hot Rod Power Tour will be held June 7<sup>th</sup> thru 14<sup>th</sup>. Registration is now open on line at Familyevents.com. The route starts at Charlotte, NC and ends at the Dells in Wisconsin, covering about 2600 miles!

Bob and Karen Arnoldink won the 50/50 raffle of \$23! Bruce and Debbie Hayes' name was pulled for our attendance drawing, but they weren't at the meeting, so the pot grows for November!

Now, about our Color Tour! First I want to congratulate Scott VanTamelen for organizing a fantastic time! The weather was almost perfect with sunny skies, and temps perfect for both man and machine! I didn't count, but about 15 cars and 30 people gathered at the Elhart Campus early Saturday morning before leaving around 9:15 am. We drove up old US 31, first stopping in Montague to watch the pumpkin roll. I think that was a first for most of us! I can cross that off my bucket list. We hit the road again and next stopped in Hart at a former Pontiac dealership, which is still open for business! No, they aren't selling new Pontiacs (we all wish!), but are now selling used cars. The building is covered in polished yellow ceramic bricks, inside and out. It started out as a Kaiser/ Frasier dealership in the late 1940s, but Paul Hodges' grandfather bought the place and started a Pontiac and Buick franchise in the mid 1950s. The business was successful right up to the end, around 2005 (give or take) when they sold the franchises to another local dealer. Paul decided not to close the place, but deal in used cars. Over the years, he has bought back many of the cars they sold to local residents, including a 1965 Buick Electra, 1970 Tempest, 1976 Grand Prix SJ, and a 1977 Grand Prix LJ. They still have a 1975 Buick LeSabre convertible they bought new and decided to keep. Paul also bought a clean 1939 Buick Special Eight and a 1962 Buick Electra at auctions to display with the other old cars. It was a trip back in time to visit Hodges Pontiac-Buick in Hart!

We were back on the road heading to Pentwater, which was hosting a car show downtown. The guys looked at the cars and some quenched their thirst, while the ladies visited the many shops lining main street. About an hour later, we headed south to get a bite to eat at the Stoney Lake Inn. As we were finishing up our meals, the rain finally caught up to us. So we all got a little wet as we made our way back to our homes. All in all, it was a great day! Most of it was warm and sunny, perfect for a cruise. Unfortunately, the fall colors were not very brilliant, but you could see some trees were trying! Didn't matter, we had a great time! Thanks Scott for a fantastic cruise!
