BRAD SHORES





The steel drum group classes/projects are directed by **BRAD SHORES**, **musician**, **composer**, **arranger**, and **leader** has been playing the pan since 1986 and has since become the owner of Tropical Shores Productions based in Newton, KS. He has performed over the years with numerous bands, but most of the time with his own band, "Tropical Shores." He and his late wife, Linda, were regulars at events such as the Kansas State Fair and many other events and festivals. Also performing with him were his three children, Jaimie, Collin, and Bri.

Brad is the director of steel pan at Bethel College after completing a 30-year career teaching 5-12 instrumental music in Kansas. In 2016, Brad was selected as the Kansas Music Educator Teacher of the Year. He is best known for his many arrangements, compositions, and pan tunes series of play-along pan books. Brad's popular youtube channel "Tropical Shores Steel Drum Lessons is followed by over 1000 people and continues to grow. He is also a popular band clinician, marching band specialist, and band adjudicator in and around Kansas.

JAIMIE SHORES



JAIMIE SHORES has been playing steel drums professionally since she was 8 years old. She grew up playing pans in her family band, "Tropical Shores" in KS. She has performed at thousands of events such as fairs, weddings, luaus, private parties, corporate events, and many more. Jaimie is a classically trained percussionist and has taught public school, private lessons, high school drum lines, and steel drum groups for over 10 years. Now located in Milwaukee, Jaimie is playing as a solo pannist with professionally mastered backing tracks.

JAMES (JT) TAYLOR



JAMES (JT) TAYLOR, musician, composer, and leader has studied music since he was 10 years old. He earned a degree in music performance focusing on percussion instruments. In 1982, JT discovered steel drums while teaching a Boys and Girls Club group, then spent years in the Caribbean performing aboard cruise ships and learning more about steel drums and the people of Trinidad. Currently, JT spends several months each year in Trinidad performing for the Carnival season with a 120 piece steel drum orchestra. He has helped to wim 6 first place Panorama champions with Sfozata in Trinidad, Pan Sonatas in New York, and North Stars in St. Lucia.

SESSION DESCRIPTIONS

Music Sessions – learning new music following a standard format; all music is provided in lead sheet and in parts with extra Flow and Groove parts to individualize based on the your needs and for players you may have back home at all different levels. Learn different rhythms that are used to set up the correct style for each piece of music. Improvisation is offered for those who would like.

Theory 101, Brad Shores – Basic music theory that will cover concepts such as Note values, key signatures, basic signs and terms

Theory 102, Jaimie Shores – Basic music theory that will cover concepts such as notes, clefs, triad

Theory 201, James Taylor – Intermediate music theory that will cover concepts such as building more complex chords and how to interpret chord symbols

Theory 202, James Taylor – Intermediate music theory that will cover concepts such as more complex theory issues and chord progressions

Sticks 'n Licks, Brad Shores - simple tricks to use in improvisation including grace notes, and licks used in simple improvisation

Jammin' with Jaimie, Jaimie Shores - Improvisational techniques focusing on scales and chord outlining

Island Groovin', James Taylor - Improvisation approach that focuses on simple chord progressions and how to play over changes

Equipment – What equipment is used in a gig situation


Building Your Band – Putting a band together from the ground up
