

Discerning the Road Ahead

The Agile Church: Spirit-Led Innovation in an Uncertain Age stands as one of the most influential yet books I read during my doctoral studies at the University of Dubuque Theological Seminary. But it's not a book designed for seminarians. Rather, it's a book designed for church leaders—and soon-to -be church leaders like you. That's why I'm excited to begin a "journey of exploration" beginning Wednesday, May 18. I'm calling our journey, "Odd Wednesdays" because we will only meet on the first and third Wednesday of each month through the summer. This schedule recognizes that there are vacations, VBS, baseball games, and mission trips which affect many of us during the summer.

I believe this will be a critical journey for our congregation. Consider where we are as a church: We have experienced changes in leadership; in fact, I'm one of the changes in the leadership of this church. I'm not alone in that distinction as there have been—and continue to be—other changes in the leadership of our church.

We are emerging from a global pandemic which shut down many of our ministries while raising the possibility of new ministries. However, now we are emerging from our pandemic, but we are doing so at the end of a school year, and that is typically a time when church programming winds down for the summer.

Fall is not that far away. How will we connect people to Jesus Christ once we kick off our fall Sunday school program? How will we conduct Wednesday night programming? And most importantly, what is God up to in Aledo?

Author Dwight Zscheile maintains that the innovation explored in *The Agile Church* "is not one more quick-fix strategy for the church in order to reclaim some form of institutional success that it has lost." Rather, I plan to use *The Agile Church* as a springboard for discernment, for our mission is not only to connect people to Jesus Christ; it is also to be connected to the Spirit who is already moving among us.

This journey is critical for church leaders, especially those who are already serving on our Administrative Council or other committees or teams of our church. However, it is not restricted to those persons only. Anyone

Midwest Mission Operation Ukraine Update

Partnerships are key to what Midwest Mission does. This past week, Operations Manager, Brad Walton, received a request from partner, Northstar Foundation - to help with Operation Ukraine, another non-profit requesting food for Ukraine.

Brad says, "I was then contacted by the Director of Operation Ukraine, Kathy Caden. Operation Ukraine, based in Columbus, MS, was founded in 1999 and concentrates on helping in Ukraine and Haiti.

They have a warehouse space for goods and apartments in Poland from which goods are distributed in smaller truckloads to the war-torn regions needing it most.

Midwest Mission agreed to send 12,000 rice meal packs that, when prepared, will feed 72,000 people. Midwest Mission's Operations Specialist Ramon Ortiz transported the shipment April 11 to Mississippi. It will then be shipped to Poland and is slated to arrive in three to four weeks.

Value: \$12,000

Volunteers and staff prayed over the load of much-needed humanitarian relief before its departure.

Connecting with the Word

Throughout the month of May, my sermons will lead us on a "deep dive" of Acts chapter 16. I encourage you to read that rich chapter every week, if not every day throughout the month. Because of special events in May such as confirmation, Mother's Day, and Memorial Day, I will be adjusting my sermons to those events.

We begin the month with Holy Communion on Sunday, May 1. In addition to Acts 16, scriptures include Psalm 30; Revelation 5:11-14; and John 21:1-19. My sermon will be, "Life's Most Important Question."

Sunday, May 8 is Mother's Day, and I'll be preaching, "A Woman with an Open Heart." Scriptures include Acts 16; Psalm 23; Revelation 7:9-17; and John 10:22-30.

"When God Gives You a Vision" is the title of my sermon for Sunday, May 15. Scriptures include Psalm 148; Revelation 21:1-6; John 13:31-35; and, of course, Acts 16.

I'll be touching on the subject of suicide in my Sunday, May 22 sermon, "Don't Harm Yourself," which, again, is drawn from Acts 16. Other scriptures include Psalm 67; Revelation 21:10, 22-22:5; and John 14:23-29.

We wrap the month up on Sunday, May 29, and I plan to preach, "Can You Sing, 'Free'?" from Acts 16. Other scriptures include Acts 1:1-11; Psalm 47; Ephesians 1:15-23; and Luke 24:44-53.
