

AULD LANG SYNE

"Should old acquaintance be forgot, and never brought to mind? Should old acquaintance be forgot, and days of auld lang syne? For auld lang syne, my dear, for auld lang syne, we'll take a cup of kindness yet, for auld lang syne." You've heard those words countless times...but do you know what they mean? Where they came from? Let me tell you! "Auld Lang Syne" is an extremely old Scottish folk song. The words, handed down orally for many years, were first written down in 1788 by legendary Scottish poet Robert "Bobby" Burns. Scottish musician George Thomson set those lyrics to the tune of "Can Ye Labour Lea", a Scottish folk melody. As Scots emigrated around the world, they took the song with them.

The song was played by Guy Lombardo and his Royal Canadians as a New Year's Eve song for the first time on December 31, 1929- it was the band's theme song for years. The song still kicks off the Times Square celebration every New Year's Eve. In the movie "When Harry Met Sally", Harry (Billy Crystal) talks about never fully understanding what the song means. "*I* mean, 'Should old acquaintance be forgot'? Does that mean that we should forget old acquaintances, or does it mean if we happened to forget them, we should remember them, which is not possible because we already forgot?"

As much a drinking song as a song of remembrance, the title literally translates "old long since"- the equivalent of "long long ago", "days gone by" or even "once upon a time." When we sing this song, we are saying, "We'll drink a cup of kindness yet for times gone by." The song speaks of fondly and resolutely remembering the past...while we face the future. I fear, especially at the beginning of a new year, too many of us not only remember the past, but dwell there. We labor over decisions we've made, paths we've taken, things we done...or left undone. The reality is that we cannot go back and change ONE THING that has already happened. All we can do is move forward appropriately. That means we remember the good times with fondness in our heart and we learn from the hard times with resolve in our outlook.

When you "drink a cup of kindness yet for times gone by" this year, what will follow? Will it be swimming in a sea of "what if's" and "might have been's"? Or will it be a commitment and dedication to being the best... YOU...you can be in the eyes of God? To quote that great theologian Billy Joel, "*the good old days weren't always good, and tomorrow ain't as bad as it seems*"! Make 2016 the year you completely step out of the boat, in water over your head, knowing God will be there to keep you afloat!

NEW SERMON SERIES(S)!

This month, we start...a whole lot of things! At the morning services (8AM & 10:15AM), we will begin the new year with something that shouldn't happen in church...bad words!

• Sunday, January 3- <u>A Dirty Word</u> (Isaiah 58:6-7)

Prayer and Fasting can be HARD to wrap your head around! (Matthew 6:16-18, 1Thessalonians 5:16-18)

Then, beginning on January 10, we start a 7-week journey that will not only lead us partway into Lent- the season leading up to Easter- but also cause us to ask some challenging questions and look at some challenging guidelines for life as we walk through 3 Simple Questions, 3 Simple Rules. The weeks of that series are:

- <u>Sunday, January 10- Who Is God?</u> (Exodus 34:5-7a) Is it possible to adequately describe God? (Deuteronomy 32-3-4, Revelation 1:17-18)
- Sunday, January 17- <u>Who Am I?</u> (Job 14:1-2, 7-12) How does the world see us? How does God see us? (Genesis 1:26-28a, John 15:13-16))
- Sunday, January 24- <u>Who Are We Together?</u> (1Corinthians 3:1-7) What does a relationship with God actually look like? (Psalm 2:7-8, Romans 8:31-39)
- Sunday, January 31- <u>Do No Harm</u> (1Corinthians 3:16-20) What IS the least you can do? (Galatians 5:13-16, Luke 17:1-5)
- Sunday, February 7- <u>Do Good</u> (Colossians 3:12-17) What's the MOST you do? (3John 1:11, Luke 6:27-31)
- Sunday, February 14- <u>Stay In Love With God</u> (Psalm 31:21-24) What does "in love" actually mean? (Deuteronomy 6:5-9, John 3:16-17)
- Sunday, February 21- <u>Praying It, Living It</u> (Philippians 4:4-8) How do we wrap this all up together? (Psalm 40:1-2, 4a, Isaiah 41:9-10)

At The Point, our 6PM Sunday worship service, we will spend some time looking at plans for the New Year that can actually make a difference as we navigate Resolutions. The weeks of this series are:

- January 3- <u>Stay Positive</u> (Philippians 4:4-8)
- Keep your face to the sunshine and you cannot see a shadow.
- January 10- <u>Be Thankful</u> (1Thessalonians 5:15-19) Thankfulness is the beginning of gratitude. Gratitude is the completion of thankfulness.
- January 17- <u>Understand the Difference Between "Get To" and "Have To</u>" (1Peter 1:2-5) When you get up in the morning, think about what a precious privilege it is to be alive.
- January 24- <u>Mentor and Be Mentored</u> (1Thessalonians 5:9-11) The delicate balance of mentoring someone is not creating them in your own image, but giving them the opportunity to create themselves.
- January 31- <u>Bloom Where You're Planted</u> (2Timothy 2:15) When we are no longer able to change a situation - we are challenged to change ourselves.
- February 7- <u>Enjoy the Ride</u> (Matthew 11:27-30)
 A lot of people don't appreciate the moment...until it's passed.

Come each week expecting God to speak to you in powerful ways!

Have you noticed how busy the church is these days? Our custodians tells me that they are having an increasingly difficult time even finding opportunities to clean because there are ALWAYS folks in the building! That is a GREAT thing! And it's great because we not simply busy for the sake of being busy. Instead, we are busy connecting people to Jesus Christ. It's the yardstick by which we measure every-thing we do here. As the number of ministries grows, so does the need for funding. A church that averages 250 people each Sunday in worship and continues to add a great many new ministries has a higher budget than a church that doesn't do those things.

The membership vows of the United Methodist Church challenge us to support the church through our prayers, our presence, our gifts, our service and our witness. And I would argue that those are ALL important...not just the "gifts" part. The church works at its best when we it lift up through our prayers, through our presence (literally being here), our gifts (both monetary and otherwise), our service (rolling up our sleeves and being about God's business) and our witness (sharing with others the difference God has made in our lives).

In late December, you should have received a packet in the mail- a letter encouraging you to pray about your financial support of the church in 2016. I would encourage you to do just that- pray about it. Ask God how He is called you to support your church this year. Then, on Sunday, January 17 at all 3 worship services, we will all be invited to come forward and offer our commitment to God. I Have a Dream

On Monday, January 19th, we celebrate the anniversary of the birth of slain civil rights leader Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. For our kids, it's a day off from school. My experience is that for many of them, that's <u>all</u> it is. Why DO we celebrate this man's birthday?

Although he is often labeled as simply an advocate of African-American rights, Dr. King's message truly transcended any notion of merely being a spokesman for a particular group. His was NOT simply a message of race and color; his was a message of hope- grounded in strong Biblical principles. When he delivered what was arguably his most famous speech, he said, "I have a dream." His dream was NOT that we would let ethnicity separate us. His dream was NOT that people of a particular skin color would strike out against those of another color. His dream was NOT that children would learn to hate others because of their physical appearance. His dream was that ALL people could live together in peace and harmony, regardless of the color of their skin. When that glorious day happened, he said, we would be able to quote the old spiritual and exclaim, "Free at last. Free at last. Thank God Almighty, we are free at last!"

We are all unique and we are all different. That's NOT our weakness- it's our strength! Our diversity makes us strong. We are all children of God- made in His image. This month, take a moment and reflect on Dr. King. Tell your kids or grand-kids about him. My prayer is his prayer- that one day we will live in a world where people aren't judged by the color of their skin, but the content of their heart.

In 1 Corinthians 2:1-5, Paul said to the Corinthians "When I came to you, brothers, I did not come with eloquence or superior wisdom as I proclaimed to you the testimony about God. For I resolved to know nothing while I was with you except Jesus Christ and him crucified. I came to you in weakness and fear, and with much trembling. My message and my preaching were not with wise and persuasive words, but with a demonstration of the Spirit's power, so that your faith might not rest on men's wisdom, but on God's power."

Paul resolved to let nothing get in the way of telling people about Jesus. This would be a very worthy New Year's resolution - to tell your friends, family, neighbors, anyone who will listen about Jesus. To live your life in such a way that nothing can get in the way of introducing people to the Savior King.


