This Bond is one of an issue of like tenor and date consisting of nine bonds of Five Hundred Dollars each,

numbered from one to nine inclusive, amounting in the aggregate to fifty five hundred dollars, authorized by vote of the Plantation of Monhegan April 3rd A.D. 1922, to raise funds for the construction of a plantation wharf or landing on the Island of Monhegan. It is further agreed by all parties, that if the said Plantation of Monhegan desires to call in and cancel the same by payment thereof any time after a period of Five years, they shall have that right and privilege by paying the face of the Bond and interest accrued at time of cancellation.
