IN THE CLUBHOUSE AND POOL FOR TOWN HOUSES OR APARTMENTS? Do you think it would improve our community?

Certainly this situation would be a worst case scenario. But, it could happen. The Recreational Club (RRRC) must have 150 members to limp along next year and should have 200 members annually to stay financially viable. I encourage you to join at the \$200.00 per year level to keep the Clubhouse running. Dues of \$225.00 include use of the pool. Without the Clubhouse, the meetings of our homeowners associations would have to be in a volunteer's house or front yard.

The Recreational Club has had insufficient participation. If the current Board of the Recreational Club votes to dissolve, the property – Clubhouse, pool and tennis courts – would be transferred to another Bexar County non-profit. If that entity decides that the property is not needed, it may sell the land to a developer. And, development is what we would get.

We need to raise \$25,000 to refurbish the pool. If

we are unsuccessful, we will have to close and cover over or fill the pool with dirt. If the community no longer desires to have a pool, all it takes is a lack of support. We may be able to keep the Clubhouse without an operational pool. However, we need young families to maintain high home values and perpetuate our community. An elementary school and a community center with a pool are essential ingredients to attract them.

RRRC volunteers exist. Diane Luna and Deb **Kennedy** have carried the RRRC as Board members and as volunteers. Other Board members have contributed their time. Kim and Dave Hermann spent nearly full time at the club three administrations ago, "singularly" maintained the pool, grounds and clubhouse and generally had it on a sound footing. Bob Robbins has provided guidance to the Board and has also maintained the pool on a daily basis for several years. Ernie Jones has worked during the 3-hour per month volunteer work sessions, and whenever he is called upon. His wife, Frances, is on the RRRC Board. The Clubhouse. pool and tennis courts require continuous maintenance. We don't need 10 volunteers: we need 200.

I will provide an additional <u>incentive</u> for you to join. I will give four (4) one-hour seminars to RRRC members for the 2015-2016 year. For those who agree to contribute one hour per seminar to the Club, I will talk about investments, taxes, estate planning, and how to help you save money on things like home remodeling and repairs. Please join the Board at its *next meeting* on *May 19* at *6:30 PM* at the Clubhouse. We each can change our individual priorities and make RRRC a yearly and monthly priority. Let us all join and act on behalf of our wonderful community.

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

ROYAL RIDGE CITIZENS ON PATROL

started my article last month noting we live in a particularly safe neighborhood and thanked our residents, past and present Citizens on Patrol (COP) members, and past and present San Antonio Fear Free Environment (SAFFE) Officers for their efforts on our behalf to make it so. Let's not rest on our laurels though as any lapses in our individual and collective vigilance will certainly be exploited by the ne'er-do-wells and opportunists.

Want to know about police activity and crimes reported in our neighborhood in near real time and over time? Visit the San Antonio Police Department (SAPD) Crime and Call Information webpage, http://www.sanantonio.gov/sapd/CrimeandCallInformation.aspx, and click on the "Calls for Service" and "Areas Crime Maps" links.

The first will lead you to a page where you can review non-dispositioned calls, i.e. calls actively being worked by police officers; or historical calls, i.e. calls from the previous month and earlier by day, week or month, area, etc. depending on your search criteria. There are several geographic filters available. To view calls from Royal Ridge use the Homeowner Association drop down menu to select it and then either press the "View Data" or "Map It" buttons.

The "Area Crime Maps" page will show you that the SAPD is continuously busy. To zoom in on our neighborhood, type in your address, expand the "Event" bar and press the "Select All" button at the bottom of the list to see what has been happening in our neighborhoods and nearby for the past 30 days. Fortunately, we have fewer and less serious calls for the most part than nearby neighborhoods and certainly other parts of San Antonio. Again, I attribute much of that to our interested and involved neighbors, COP members, the SAPD, and our SAFFE officers.

Let's keep it going. Report any and all suspicious persons, vehicles and activities to the SAPD on their nonemergency number at the time you witness it. Put the number in your cell phone directory—207-SAPD (207-7273). If you are in doubt, call anyway—the dispatcher will send an officer to check it out.

Is there unusual activity happening down the block or somewhere else in the neighborhood, or a high volume of traffic, people coming and going at all hours, etc.? If yes, then contact our SAFFE officer, **Officer Jason Reno** by email and let him know about it and of your concerns. Officer Reno's email is jason.reno@sanantonio.gov. He has expressly invited us to let him know of such activity.
