Washpot Chili: A General Grand Chapter Committee Tradition

Washpot chili? Ever hear of "washpot" chili? I never had, but I was going to find out what it was. I am the Grand Representative of Arkansas in California and planned to attend this event on October 14 in Greenbrier, Arkansas. Twice a year in Arkansas, two major fund raisers are held in the airplane hanger, at the home of Ira and Mavis Payne. These two events are "Hangerburgers" and "Washpot" Chili. Hangerburgers usually takes place over Memorial Day, while Washpot Chili is held in the fall.

Arriving at their hanger, I first spied a large wash pot hanging over a fire with some chili bubbling in the pot. Attendees bring chili to be added to the wash pot (which was Mavis' grandmother's wash pot) or a salad, appetizer or dessert. Hot dogs are also provided. Each participant pays a nominal fee to attend and eat.



Members bring items to be auctioned off by seasoned auctioneer, Andy Miller, PGP with the proceeds going to the WGM and WGP special project. With the help of friends, I managed to obtain several items donated for a large basket of California goodies...all of which were either grown or produced in California. Some of these items included dried apricots , dried dates, almonds, sparkling cider, salt water taffy, elephant garlic, See's candy, honey and pistachios. Winning bid for the basket was \$100! This year's wash pot chili event served a dual purpose. Both Ira and Mavis are General Grand Chapter Committee members. Mavis is Membership and Ira is Service Dogs. In lieu of a formal reception to honor their General Grand Committee appointments, they elected to celebrate at Wash Pot Chili and the WGM Marilyn and WGP Chuck, graciously allowed all funds raised that day to go towards Ira Payne's committee – Service Dogs. (Note: \$1,000.00 was raised that day.)

This was one of the most relaxed General Grand Chapter Committee receptions I have ever attended as there was NO ESCORT and the dress code was sport casual. Food was excellent with the flavors of all of the combined chili donations, and with a beautifully decorated cake for the main dessert.

Next year's Washpot Chili event will be held on October 20, so if you are in the Greenbrier, Arkansas area, be sure to attend.
