February 16, 2020 Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time Mt 5:17-37

Dear St Pius X and St Anthony Church,

"He laid down the law"! Ever heard that? Usually that means a judge or an authority figure has spoken an ultimatum and that is ruled the end of it! Thanks be to God we have in Jesus an example of 'case' law that is coherent, humane and life-giving. Jesus came to earth to show us how to live. He says, "I am the Way, the truth and the life" (John 14:6). So, Jesus came to lay down the law of his life for us (John 10:15). This is behind Jesus' statement that He "came not to abolish but to fulfill {the Law}" (Matt 5:17). In His Sermon on the Mount, Jesus is teaching not only the words of the traditional law, but also, Jesus is teaching the way of living the law. The 'Way of the Law' means the purpose, intention and meaning of the Law. Jesus begins by reciting the actual commandment words. Simple Enough? Yes, if understood and followed. But, Jesus anticipates that listeners are going to dismiss him, saying, 'Okay Professor Obvious, tell us something we don't know-what is new about these commandments?' But Jesus goes right on to reveal the 'newness or fulfillment' of the Law. Have they ever been truly lived? So He first repeats the 'shell' of the Law by reciting what we call the Ten Commandments (and Jesus, who reads our hearts, He knows the law is not being followed in spirit). But more importantly, His <u>Way</u> of teaching dives deeper to reveal the 'heart' of the Law. This 'heart of the Law' turns out to be Jesus Himself! Jesus is saying, we should not just follow the Law, but we should understand and know why we are following the Law. It has been said that if you want to know the meaning of the Law, talk to the Lawgiver. I like how Jesus notes that asking people not to murder, is not asking much. A lot of things stir within a person before murder comes along. If we really want to know 'the life of the Law' about murder, we must study our anger. Work on the hurt and bitterness in our hearts. Why are we tempted to strike back and act out? If we work in our heart, rooting out resentments, then we will never get near to murder. After murder, Jesus moves on to another commandment. How about coveting & adultery? We must examine our imaginations and manage our minds' fantasies, so that lust does not grab a hold or seduce us. Also, how about 'bearing false witness'? Review the selfish claims of pride or greed that we tell our own egos, and we will catch our own deceit and avoid lying to others. In Matthew 5, we do not hear Jesus open up every commandment of God like this, but he does enough of them to teach us the pattern of understanding more than just the words of the Law. He teaches the 'Way' of living of the Law, and drawing the full life from the Law that God intends for us. So Jesus came to show us the 'heart' (Himself) of the Law. He came to 'fulfill' it, or to 'fill it full' with God's original, life-giving purpose with-in-for it. Jesus is saying that he came to teach the 'filling' of the Law: what is inside of it, or again the 'heart of the matter'. Keeping the Law fosters and furthers life. Not following it, diminishes and destroys life.

I find a repeat of this Sermon on the Mount episode, later in the gospel when a wealthy young man goes to Jesus asking to be taught what will lead him to eternal life. It is in Matthew 19:16-26. Jesus begins again by reciting the basic commandments, to which the young man (like today's crowd) is quick to dismiss, boasting he already knows/does them. So Jesus points out how obviously the 'simple words' of the Law are not enough for the man. So to have him move into his heart a little more deeply, Jesus challenges him to go sell everything he has and give it to the poor for the glory of God! Wow! That will take anyone into their heart. The man had to ask himself, "What does my stuff mean to me? Can I let go of it? Maybe stuff means more to me than eternity?" Such questions push us further into the 'fulfillment work' of God's law (not just its observance). How Jesus deals with the rich young man in Matthew 19 and how Jesus deals with all of us in Sermon in the Mount reminds me of the wise answer of parents to their little children's automatic reply of 'why', then 'why', then 'why'. I think Jesus' Sermon on the Mount invites all of us to examine not just 'if' we are following the law, but 'how' (the way) we are following the law. Is the law 'lifegiving' as God intends it to be for us? For me, the Sermon on the Mount is the rest of the story begun with Moses on another Mountain. Moses gave the words, and Jesus gives the 'why' (the way). Again, Moses 'laid down the law' while Jesus 'laid down the life of the law'. Jesus is the 'case law', showing us by example the 'way' of the law's perfect fulfillment. He is the Law's heart.


