MAY 11, 2017 MEETING MINUTES - Barbara Rothe

Chairman Nancy Ordowski called the meeting to order at 7:00 P.M. at the Via Linda Senior Center. Tim Horn gave the prayer and Arthur Cooper led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Chairman Ordowski then introduced the guests in attendance. She also acknowledged Rep. Michelle Ugenti-Rita.

Second Vice-Chairman, Rich Rutkowski, introduced the evening's speaker, Maricopa County Recorder, Adrian Fontes. Recorder Fontes spoke about the changes he would like to make in registration and voting procedures. Many questions were asked.

Rich Rutkowski explained the reason for a "permission" form, copies of which were distributed to attendees for completion and signature. This is in response to recently enacted state legislation which allows the District to give notification for Organizational Meetings to a PC by e-mail if the PC authorizes the District to do so. PCs are not required to give this authorization but it will facilitate the process while producing substantial savings in postage and distribution costs. The next Organizational Meeting will be in late 2018.

Jim O'connor spoke about the need to continue opposing the National Popular Vote compact. The fact that it was not acted upon in this legislative session does not mean it will not be brought up again in the next session.

Mark Singer gave information about the FreedomFest being held in Las Vegas July 19-22, 2017.
