"When our Lord and Master Jesus Christ said, 'Repent,' he willed the entire life of believers to be one of repentance." Thesis 1 of Luther's 95 Theses

By the Middle Ages much of the leadership of the Catholic Church had become corrupt. High church offices were bought and sold. Many popes had mistresses and fathered children. Many church officials had lavish lifestyles. Too many priests abused their parishioners.

One doctrine that had become subject to abuse was the understanding of the nature of forgiveness of sins for Christians. Confession was thought to provide deliverance from hell, but there might still be temporal punishment. Most Christians would probably have to go through the purging fires of purgatory before they could arrive in heaven. So the Church offered indulgences whereby temporal punishment could be lessened and time off from purgatory granted. Priests could sell these indulgences as long as the pope got a cut.

In 1515 Pope Leo X was trying to figure out how to finance his latest building project, the construction of St. Peter's Basilica. So he came up with this special indulgence whereby even sins of adultery and theft could be forgiven. A priest by the name of Johann Tetzel was given the authority to offer (sell) this indulgence in Germany. The popular saying that he promoted was "When a coin into the coffer rings, a soul from purgatory springs."

The smell of this was a little too much for Martin Luther. He was the town preacher and professor of moral theology at the University of Wittenberg. The traditional story was that he nailed a list of 95 points of contention with church teaching and practice on to the door of the church in Wittenberg on October 31, 1517, 500 years ago this coming Tuesday. Some historians doubt that this actually happened. But it is certain that he mailed a copy of his 95 theses to his church superior, the Bishop of Brandenburg, on or before that date. He also sent a copy to the Archbishop of Mainz.

This provoked considerable controversy, news of which went all the way to the pope. With the advent of the printing press, Martin Luther expressed his opinions in print on a variety of other issues that seemed to go contrary to the teaching and practice of the Church. He especially stressed the Biblical concept that eternal salvation came through faith alone.

The controversy culminated in a conference that was held in 1521 at Worms. Representatives of the pope demanded that Luther recant his views in regard to several of his teachings. His famous reply was: "Unless I am convinced by the testimony of the Scriptures or by clear reason (for I do not trust either in the pope or in councils alone, since it is well known that they have often erred and contradicted themselves), I am bound by the Scriptures I have quoted and my conscience is captive to the Word of God. I cannot and will not recant anything, since it is neither safe nor right to go against conscience. May God help me. Amen."

This led to a definite break with the Catholic Church. Luther was declared to be a heretic. Luther's prolific and powerful writings were influential in the development of Protestant Christianity. The concepts of faith alone, grace alone, Christ alone and Scripture alone were part of the legacy that he left for Christians who found their authority in God's Word, not in an institutional church. 
