

JAMES BRIGHT DIES AT BAD AXE HOSPITAL

Death Came Without Warning Wednesday Morning.

James Bright, died from a blood clot which went to the heart following an operation at the Bad Axe Hospital at ten o'clock Wednesday morning. His death was unexpected and came as a shock to all.

On June 11, Mr. Bright fractured his leg while working on a bridge job he had near Forrester and had been in the hospital since that time.

James Bright was born in Listowel, Ontario on April 20, 1876. He spent his boyhood days in the vicinity of his birth. When a young man he went to Yale where he was engaged as manager of a flax mill. Thirty-one years ago he came to Pigeon to take charge of the flax mill at this place, a position he held for about five years. Later he engaged in the hardware 'business' at Gilford for one year. He then returned to Pigeon to engage in the meat and cattle shipping business in partnership with W. W. Loosemore for three years.

Fifteen years ago he went into the road contracting business and continued in that business up to the time of his death. He was one of the best known and most successful contractors in the state.

Twenty-eight years ago he was united in marriage with Lilly Loosemore who survives him. He also leaves two brothers, John Bright of Yale and Charles Bright of Edmonton, Alberta; four sisters, Mrs. William Shearer, Jannett Bright, Mary Bright and Barbara Bright of Listowel, Ontario.

Mr. Bright always took an active interest in civic affairs and was an ex-member of the village council. Few men in the western part of Huron County were better known.

He was a member of Winsor Lodge F. & A. M., Pigeon Royal Arch, Bay City Consistory and Elf Khurafeh Shrine of Saginaw.

The funeral service will be conducted at the home at 1:30 Saturday under the auspices of the Masonic fraternity. Burial will be at Yale.
