#### Spanish-American War Memorial Finds a Home at Our Post

Last year, exactly 100 years after the war with Spain, a strange event took place. An old building was being demolished in Brooklyn to make way for new construction. A member of the demolition crew just happened to be a legionnaire. He noticed that on the cornerstone of the building was a plaque dedicated to the New York State 14th Regiment. Taking a closer look, he saw that it was a memorial listing the names of those men who had made the supreme sacrifice in the Spanish-American War.

Rather than see this memorial wind up in the Fresh Kills landfill, he retrieved this plaque and notified a member of our Post, Leo Milham. Leo gladly accepted this old tarnished brass plaque and brought it to our Post.

It has taken some months, but thanks to the efforts of Post member Vincent Zangari, this plaque (which measures approximately 3 feet by 3 feet) has been fully restored to its original condition. We are now in the process of mounting this memorial and will give it a place of honor in our hall.

It would have been sad indeed for this memorial to deceased war veterans to wind up in a garbage dump. But thanks to these special legionnaires this plague has a new home where it will be respected. Thank you Leo and Vincent.

Scouts are saving aluminum cans, bottles and other items to be recycled. Proceeds will be used to cripple children.


The senior choir invites any member of the congregation who enjoys sinning to join the choir.


