A sampler quilt has many different blocks that are placed randomly on the quilt top.

Bindings

When hand stitching the binding on a quilt, pause every 10 to 12 inches, make a small knot and continue stitching. If the thread breaks or wears out, you will only need to re-stitch a small section.

Hanging Sleeves

Use small pieces of all the different fabrics in your quilt to make the hanging sleeve. If repairs are ever needed, the correct fabric will be right there with the quilt.

Rulers

Always use the same ruler throughout a project. This helps to prevent measurement errors.

Cleaning Teflon Sheets

Do you have residue on your Teflon sheets from fusing fabric? A new dryer sheet with a little rubbing and watch the residue disappear.

CHAIN PIECING



Chain piecing speeds up the piecing process — rather than cutting thread after you sew each piece, keep on going and sew another 2 pieces together. Eventually you'll reach the end of that chain, then snip, snip, snip or use one of the gadgets on the market such as the Clover Thread Cutter Pendant or the Cutting Gizmo.

When Should You Change Your Sewing Needle?

Experts recommend that you change your needle after 8 hours of sewing. If you're experiencing any of the following problems, try changing your needle:

Shredded or Broken Thread
Skipped Stitches
If you hear a Popping Sound coming from your
Machine

Did You Know?

Schmetz has a Universal needle with two eyes. Use two spools of thread; one thread per eye. The result is a shaded or textured stitch. This needle is a challenge, but fun. Tip: Reduce your sewing speed & stitch simple stitches.

Sirloin Steak Tips Casserole

Ingredients

1 large onion sliced
1 tsp each Garlic powder.
Onion powder, Salt, Pepper,
Thyme
1/3 cup flour
2 lbs. Steak tips or thin
sliced steak pieces
1 to 2 cans mushroom
Oil
3 cups of water, divided
1 envelope each, beef gravy,
mushroom gravy, onion gravy
Fresh parsley, chopped, for
garnish

Directions

- Put the sliced onions in the bottom of a crock pot. Combine the next 6 ingredients in a plastic bag. Put in the steak pieces and shake to cover then place a few at a time in a frying pan with hot oil and fry til browned.
- 2. Place the cooked steak pieces on top of the onions in the crock pot. Drain the mushrooms and put on top of the steaks. Pour 2 cups of water on top of that. Cover the crock pot and cook for 8 hours on low.
- 3. Mix the gravy packs with the rest of the water, and pour over the steaks, and cook another 30 minutes on low.
- 4. Garnish with the parsley, and served with noodles, rice or mashed potatoes.


