Gorgeous Garnets!

Club meeting program, April 2, 2014 – Carol Devine

- *Identifying and cutting garnets.* Garnets are softer than topaz and harder than apatite, with a Mohs' rating of 6.5 to 7.5. Garnet crystals have no cleavage plane. Their fracture is conchoidal uneven. By volume, garnet is 4 times as heavy as water, with a specific gravity of 3.54 to 4.32. For their size, they are heavier than tourmaline, quartz or calcite, but lighter than zircon. Garnets sometimes contain air pockets, which must be located prior to cutting. The garnet may "explode" when a rock saw hits an air pocket in the stone. Faceters working with Star Garnets must use special techniques to get the four, or six, rayed "star" to align properly at the top center of the finished gem.
- *Garnets in jewelry.* Garnets are beautiful in a wide variety of metal settings, and are often mounted in jewelry with citrine, opal, pearls, and diamonds. Stable to light and chemicals, garnets should be cleaned with a soft brush and warm soapy water, and protected from hard blows and extreme temperature changes.
- *Difference: Species vs Variety.* Garnets pick up minerals during the metamorphism process in the rock cycle. *Mineralogists* classify gem-quality garnets into *six species* based on their chemistry. The aluminum silicates are Pyrope, Almandine and Spessartine, which contain magnesium, iron and manganese, respectively. The calcium silicates are Andradite, Grossular and Uvarovite. They contain iron, aluminum and chromium, respectively. A garnet containing minerals from two species is classified

by mineralogists as one or the other species based on the predominant mineral. *Gemologists* take a different stance. They market that same garnet as a *variety* of the predominant species. For example, assume that a garnet has two Pyrope (magnesium) molecules and one Almandine (iron) molecule. A mineralogist calls it Pyrope, but gemologists call it Pyrope variety Rhodolite. Like Pyrope species, Rhodolite variety has few internal flaws. Both are recommended for faceting. Stunning, emerald green Tsavorite variety (see



photo) and top quality Demantoid variety garnets command high prices (Newman, 2011). Over the past 50 years, discoveries of color change garnet varieties like Malaya, and the iridescent Rainbow Garnet from Japan, have been expanding the varied and beautiful garnet family.

- Learn more through online sales ads! Become a better informed garnet buyer and collector by mining online sales ads, such as those in eBay. Find a garnet sales ad that interests you. Save the item photo to your computer (Snaglt software is recommended). Assign a number to the photo (i.e., "Garnet 14") and link it by that number to a notebook reference. Record details from the ad in the notebook reference, including species/variety, matrix, other crystals or gems in the piece, dimensions/weight, where it was mined, the vendor, final selling price and date. To learn the final selling price of an eBay auction item, save it to your "Watch List" and check the list periodically. The price history you develop over just a few fascinating months can help you recognize a good value when you find it.
- *Have you discovered this?* Exotic Gems, Volume 2, published in 2011 by professional gemologist Renee Newman, devotes 50 pages to the garnet group. She includes valuation and pricing ranges for each semi-precious gemstone reviewed. ISBN 978-0-929975-45-0. The LGMC library is now acquiring all three volumes of this instant classic.


