THE SPIRIT OF GOD DWELLS WITHIN US

Last week we heard Jesus tell His disciples, "Do not think that I have come to abolish the law or the prophets. I have come not to abolish but to fulfill" (Matthew 5:17). Indeed,



we hear Jesus use the same words in today's Gospel that the Torah uses in the first reading. "You shall not bear hatred...take no revenge...love your God says to Moses neighbor,"

(Leviticus 19:17-18). The difference is in how the word "neighbor" was understood. In Leviticus, neighbor meant "fellow citizen." The Old Testament is filled with incidents in which the Chosen people took revenge against people and leaders who persecuted them, people who were not "fellow citizens." What Jesus says, whether making a Samaritan the hero of the parable He used to answer the question, "Who is my neighbor?" or saying "Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you," is a radical change (Matthew 5:44).

"An eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth" (Matthew 5:38, from Exodus 21:24), known as the lex talionis, may seem like a defense of vengeance, but at the time it was considered a measured and moderate response. Found in records as early as the eighteenth century BCE, it was a civilized development over practices that allowed or even expected the wronged party to exact revenge way out of proportion to

the initial injury. Lex talionis prohibits wanton revenge; Jesus prohibits revenge entirely.

Still, the last instruction Jesus gives, "be perfect," sounds impossible. Only God is perfect. We are human and are incapable of true perfection. And yet, as Saint Paul says in the second

reading, "the spirit of God dwells in you" (1 Corinthians 3:16). Our challenge is to allow the Holy Spirit to come to full-and perfect-expression in us.

QUESTION OF THE WEEK:

How can I allow the Spirit to guide me more fully? How will that affect how I treat both those who treat me well and those who mistreat me?
