



The people didn't want Jesus.









The Man Returns Home and Testifies.




Bias Motivations





- nesday and Good Friday. ABSTINENCE is practiced all Fridays of Lent.

ALMSGIVING

ALMSGIVING is the action that leads us Christians to see others, love them, listen to them and them our time, help, advice, money, shelter, company, affection. It is not limited to giving material goods, it is the gift of self. It is based on CHARITY, to love God and others as oneself. To give alms is to be united to Christ in his poverty


