DOT Camp Overview

Art: Study the shapes & patterns of nature in the work of
Charlie Harper, Eric Carle, Georgia O'Keeffe & Frank Lloyd Wright.
Math: Use geometric shapes, angles, & scale factor to resize
objects + the study of lines (connected dots). The work of Friedrich
Froebel (gifts & occupations) will be intertwined.

Architecture: Focus on maximizing a confined space with legos, zoobs, ramagon, knex, & other manipulatives.

June 12 & 13 (W-TH) 9am-3pm Cost: \$70 <u>MiniDot Camp</u> is a full day camp including snacks & lunch. Recommended minimum age is 7 with maturity to handle the frustrations of mini-sizing &/or nanoblock building. Miniaturizing is the focus in all activities. Fine motor skills, attention to details, and independent work will be needed. Students will have the opportunity to analyze and build Lego Architecture miniature cities, create their own environments, & tackle architectural challenges. Differentiated activities for multiple ages are offered during this 2 day camp.

June 17-20 (M-Th)1/2 day (AM only) or full day.1/2) GIANTDot Camp9am - noonCost: \$80Recommended for students who have completed pre-K (age 5+) &/ordesire a morning only camp. Students will engage with giant sizedgames, learn how to enlarge items, build with multiple sized legos, &create large scale projects. Snack included.

(GIANTDot) Camp 9am - 3pm Cost: \$130 The full day session includes lunch, is for ages 7+ who are able to sustain independent work, & includes all **1/2**) **GIANTDot** activities with extended time for projects, building marble runs, architecture studio challenges, or lego creations.

*** **MiniDot & GIANTDot** Camps have minimal overlap of content due to size differentials, materials, & project choices. Returning **DOT** campers have "fast passes" to work independently during a few activities & might consider leading a small group activity to reduce costs. Extended day option from 3-5:00 pm is available for an additional \$10 per day for those attending full day **DOT**, Engineering A City, & Frank Lloyd Wright camps. ***

Building a City Camps

Engineering A City July 11-12 (TH-F) 9AM-3PM. \$70 Recommended age 7+. Snacks & lunch included. Gbis camp is for students who have an interest in engineering & problem solving. Focus is city infrastructure planning, bridge construction, dealing with high density populations, & natural disasters. Students will create a core community, brainstorm ideas as the city population expands to capacity, & emigrate, if desired, to remote islands.

<u>Future Cities</u> July 15-19 (M-F) 9AM-noon. \$100 Recommended grades 1-8. Snack included. Students will create cities using mixed materials on the continent of their choice (All 7 unique environments included). Creative solutions for water/power sources, land management, and environmental issues are explored as students create their visions for the future. Coordinating with others is the key. Students who bring their own lunch may stay until 12:25.

Frank Lloyd Wright July 22-25(M-Th) 9am-3pm \$130 Recommended age 8+. Gbis camp is for students who have interest in art, design & architecture. Learn about a unique style of architecture, about the inspirations (Geometric Shapes & Nature) behind the designs. & what makes it timeless. Using Legos, students create a Wright inspired complex expressing the process & use of creativity along the way to the finished product. Details might include a project board, sculpture, landscaping, coordinated stained glass, & integrated furnishings. Students might work on a site plan or specialize a specific detail to share with others. Snacks, lunch, an architectural notebook, & a copy of <u>Simply Wright</u> are included. Limited space.

Experience ZOE Camps 9AM - noon. Age 6+ Students aged 10-18 as heads of household will help select/lead the activities & support younger campers. Students aged 6-10 will join a family unit if not with an older sibling. Each session is based on a part of the 3 year ZOE empowerment program where orphans learn self-sustainability. A Musika(Market) will be planned. Registration is required with a donation of adult time, supplies, or \$ to cover costs.
