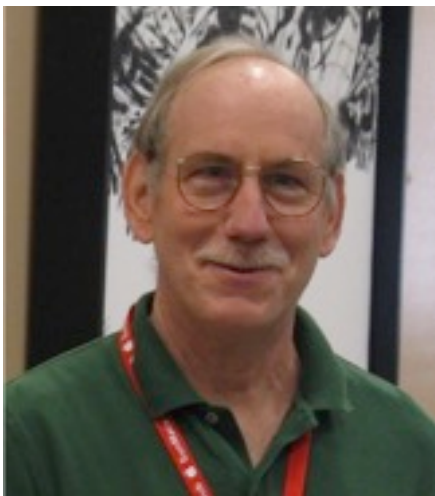
1. **First Vice President** to replace Mike Graham who has moved out of state.

1. Use strong passwords: use a mixture of upper & lower case letters with numbers and symbols. Passwords should be more than 12 digits long. Use a separate password for each site. Maintaining a list of passwords can be overwhelming so use a program such as 1Password to help manage all your passwords. You still will need to know the program log in password.

2. Use a secure WiFi network. You can tell a secure WiFi network by looking for a padlock icon next to the network name. When using a secure network you will be prompted to enter a password in order to use the network.

Back Up –Be Safe: Backing up data is always important. Learn how you can do this.

Board Meeting: The Board Members meet at this time.

EXCEL FUN ! These 2 sessions will be taught by John Always and *You Must pre-register!*

GAMES, EMOJIS & OTHER FUN STUFF: A RT on gaming on Apple devices. What games do you play? How did you get it? What's involved?

Genealogy SIG: For those interested in studying their roots and exchanging ideas & research techniques.

Genealogy-DNA: Using DNA information to aid your genealogy. Where to search for relatives.

General Genealogy : This RT on Ancestry, Reunion, and other general topics.

I CALENDAR RT: Using applications within the newest operating system. Bring your iPad or iPhone.

🍏 **INTERMEDIATE NUMBERS SPREADSHEET:** These two sessions will delve further into how to use Numbers. Again this software is somewhat similar to Excel.

🍏 **KEYBOARD SHORTCUTS AND SAVING PROFICIENTLY:** Using SHORTCUTS will help you ease your reliance on the mouse and making you more proficient in using your MAC.

How many times have you had difficulty finding a saved document? The tips given in **SAVING PROFICIENTLY** will help you quickly find your document.

NEW MEMBER ORIENTATION & MONITOR TRAINING: All new members are encouraged to attend this orientation session. Learn about your new club and the classes and activities available.

MONITOR TRAINING discussion will also be included. It is important for all members to give back to their club. Serving as a monitor is one way to do that.

🍏 **MAC BASICS PLUS:** Learn many tips on using your MAC more proficiently.

🍏 **MAC LAPTOP BASICS:** Purpose: (1) To learn the basic functions of the Macintosh computer using OSX; (2) To provide hands on experiences to practice these functions; and (3) To promote a desire to learn more about the many features of the **Mac Laptop** computer. You **must pre-register for all sessions.** *Sign up sheet is in the clubroom.* The classes are one hour long for **four (4)** sessions.

MAINTENANCE: Bring your computer woes to this session and Colonel will help you with your problems.

🍏 **MASTERING YOUR MAC :** Learn the basics of operating your MAC computer. You **must pre-register for all sessions.** *Sign up sheet is in the clubroom.* The classes are one hour long for **FIVE (5)** sessions

🍏 **PHOTOS FOR THE MAC:** This is the program to store photos from your camera, scanner, etc. Also how you can edit and use these photos.

PREVIEW: Colonel will show things you can do with Preview. Working with pdfs. is one of them.

RT: RT stands for “*Round Table*”. RT's are discussion groups lead by a Facilitator in which Club Members share their knowledge with other members.

SOCIAL: Club members get together, talk and exchange ideas over coffee & goodies.

TIME MACHINE: This application automatically saves up-to-date copies of everything on your Mac — photos, music, videos documents, applications, and settings. If you ever have the need, you can easily go back in time to recover anything..

WALK-IN HELP : A club member will be available to help with problems.

Apple devices will “remember” secure networks that you have logged in before, so you don’t have to re-enter the password each time.

3. When shopping/banking on the internet make sure the site you are visiting is a valid and secured site. A secured web site has an “s” displayed after “http”.. Https will also show up as a padlock icon. Look for a name right after the “www.” So “www.amazon” would direct you to the Amazon web page. Some shopping sites will allow shopping in the unsecured area of the site, but will direct you to a secure window when it is time to enter personal and credit card information. 4. While the Mac and iOS devices have not had a lot of virus attacks, many owners have been taken advantage of by Phishing e-Mails. Phishing e-mails look and act like the legitimate e-mails. If you click on the link you may be taken to a false site (Looks like the real site) tricking you into giving away your personal/financial information. Go with what you know. Assume that all e-mails are trying to extract your personal information. In-

stead of clicking the link go to the website directly. Remember that you will never get e-mails from the IRS, Social Security or Medicare.

By taking the above precautions exploring the internet should be fun and uneventful.

MONITORS

Why should you consider serving as a monitor?

The Recreation Centers Chartered Club Board Policy states: “All clubs are required to have club monitors...in the event a club monitor is not present during club scheduled activities, the club will be closed.” In order to comply with these rules, we need all members to participate.
