A Great Spiritual Opportunity

“Now when these things begin to take place, look up and raise your heads, because your redemption is drawing near.” (Lk 21:28). Our Lord speaks here of the great hope we should have in any time of tribulation, including the current virus epidemic. And He is speaking here of a *much worse* tribulation — of natural disasters and persecutions on a level that has men “fainting with fear and with foreboding of what is coming on the world.” (Lk 21:26). Even when that time comes, we will be called to lift up our heads with hope because of what is drawing near: our redemption!

When faced with the possibility of death (though that seems a remote possibility for most of us in the current situation), we should have the attitude of St. Paul, whose “desire is to depart and be with Christ, for that is far better,” (Phil 1:23), but who is willing to remain on the earth if that is God’s will, to work for the salvation of others. The current crisis is a wonderful opportunity to bear witness to others of our own peace, calm, faith, and hope in Christ and in what — we hope — awaits us after this life. That calm, joyful witness can help others discover the only true source of hope and life: our Blessed Lord. It is a great blessing for our societies—the vast majority of which have turned away from God—to be faced with this crisis and with the possibility of death (however remote, in fact, that possibility is). The knowledge of that of imminent death can be most helpful. It can lead people to reflect on how they are spending their time, on the meaning of life, on what is truly important, on the mistakes they have made.

This is therefore a time for the Church to invite all men to embrace “The Way, the Truth, and the Life,” (Jn 14:6) to give them hope that salvation is possible for them, that with God’s grace they can change their lives and receive His forgiveness. For those still attending Mass — whether in person or following online — it is a good opportunity to preach on the four last things: death, judgment, Heaven, and Hell. For those with no faith or for those who have abandoned the practice of the faith, it is a privileged moment to evangelize, to offer them the hope that comes from the possibility of conversion and of receiving all that Christ offers.

Let us ask the Blessed Virgin Mary to obtain for each of us, through Her prayers, the grace to bear witness, right now in the midst of this

crisis, to the saving truth of Christ. And let us ask Her to obtain for all those who are far from Her Son the grace of true conversion.

Una gran oportunidad espiritual

“Ahora, cuando estas cosas comienzan a suceder, mira hacia arriba y levanta la cabeza, porque tu redención se está acercando”. (Lucas 21:28) Nuestro Señor habla aquí de la gran esperanza que deberíamos tener en cualquier momento de tribulación, incluida la epidemia de virus actual. Y Él está hablando aquí de una tribulación mucho peor: de desastres naturales y persecuciones a un nivel que hace que los hombres “se desmayen con miedo y con un presentimiento de lo que viene en el mundo”. (Lucas 21:26) Incluso cuando llegue ese momento, seremos llamados a levantar la cabeza con esperanza debido a lo que se está acercando: ¡nuestra redención! Cuando nos enfrentamos a la posibilidad de muerte (aunque eso parece una posibilidad remota para la mayoría de nosotros en la situación actual), debemos tener la actitud de San Pablo, cuyo “deseo es partir y estar con Cristo, porque eso es mucho mejor” (Filipenses 1:23), pero quien está dispuesto a permanecer en la tierra si esa es la voluntad de Dios, para obrar la salvación de los demás. La crisis actual es una oportunidad maravillosa para dar testimonio a otros de nuestra propia paz, calma, fe y esperanza en Cristo y en lo que, esperamos, nos espera después de esta vida. Ese testigo tranquilo y alegre de los que más descubren la (mica fuente verdadera de esperanza y vida: Nuestro Bendito Señor.

Es una gran bendición para nuestras sociedades, el gran mayoreo de las cuales se han alejado de Dios, enfrentar esta crisis y la posibilidad de la muerte (por remota que sea, de hecho, esa posibilidad es). El conocimiento de ellos de la muerte inminente puede ser de gran ayuda. Puede llevar a las personas a reflexionar sobre cómo pasan su tiempo, sobre el sentido de la vida, sobre lo que es realmente importante, sobre los errores que han cometido. Por lo tanto, este es un momento para que la Iglesia invite a todos los hombres a abrazar “El Camino, la Verdad y la Vida” (Jn 14: 6) para darles la esperanza de que la salvación sea posible para ellos, que con la gracia de Dios puedan cambiar su vida y recibir su perdón. Para aquellos que todavía asisten a misa, ya sea en persona o siguiendo en línea, es una buena oportunidad para predicar sobre las cuatro últimas cosas; muerte, juicio, cielo e infierno. Para aquellos que no tienen fe o para aquellos que han abandonado la práctica de la fe, es un momento privilegiado para evangelizar, ofrecerles la esperanza que proviene de la posibilidad de conversión y de recibir todo lo que Cristo ofrece. Pidamos a la Santísima Virgen María que obtenga para cada uno de nosotros, a través de sus oraciones, la gracia de dar testimonio, ahora en medio de esta crisis, de la verdad salvadora de Cristo. Vamos a pedirle que obtenga para todos aquellos que están lejos de su Hijo la gracia de la verdadera conversión.

The Gloria, another kind of prayer, is either recited or sung before the collect on Sundays - except during Lent and Advent - and on feasts and solemnities. Here, "the feelings of praise that run through the hymn are intertwined with the confident pleading of divine benevolence, to end with the Trinitarian doxology, which characterizes the whole liturgical celebration," he said.

The recitation or singing of the Gloria, the Pope emphasized, "constitutes an opening of the earth to heaven." By meditating on the prayers of the Mass, the liturgy can become for us, the Pope concluded, a "true school of prayer."
