


OPENA Yard of the Month for October 2021

Selecting a Yard of the Month winner was a lot harder in October! We had three lovely yards that were nominated this month!

The Oak Park Estates Neighborhood Association (OPENA) has awarded Yard of the Month to Dr. Angela Spivey-Washington who lives at 1624 Champagne Drive. Angela's 1956 ranch style home features beautiful brick with shades of terra cotta, beige and tan. The porch is accented with love wrought ironwork painted in black. Angela has maintained the original foundation plantings, so they are always trimmed, healthy and a lustrous dark green color. The plantings are "draped" by chartreuse green potato ivy which spills out over the plantings and into the front yard by the walkway. She incorporated several plantings of Alocasia or Upright Elephant Ears in front of the brick planters. The Elephant Ears are gigantic and are the highlights of this garden! Beneath them are plantings of impatiens, begonias, lantana, caladiums, and wild inland sea oats! Her gardens are bordered by luscious green St. Augustine grass that is partially shaded in the hot summer months by a mid-size live oak tree.

Angela's gardening is a labor of love. Her neighbors on Champagne have been clamoring for her to be Yard of the Month! Now their wishes have become true! Angela's landscaping work is a welcome respite from her arduous duties as a schoolteacher. 
