


Grace & Peace from the Pastor's Desk

For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Romans 8:38-39

March! The month of St. Patrick's Day and Lent.

Before you start thinking about green beer let's think about the background of St. Patrick's Day, I had an Irish friend who was appalled by the way we celebrate the holiday, because for him in Ireland it was a very holy day. Legend has it that St. Patrick was born in Scotland, England or Wales around 4 AD, was kidnapped at the age of 16 and brought to Gaelic Ireland to work as a slave. Patrick received a message from God to escape and return home, which he did. He went back to Ireland 30 years later as a ...missionary to convert the pagan Irish to Christianity. The shamrock was used by St. Patrick as a metaphor for Christianity. The three-leaved

sprig represented the Holy Trinity: The Father, The Son, and The Holy Spirit. The shamrock has since become an iconic symbol of Ireland. It was decided that March 17th would be the date to honor him, as this was believed to be the day on which he died.

The first color associated with St. Patrick was blue, not green. It's a light shade of blue that is still evident on ancient Irish flags. Over time, though, green became the color that symbolized everything Irish. St. Patrick's Day celebrates the color green because:

- -The iconic shamrock used by St. Patrick is green
- -Ireland is known as the Emerald Isle for its lush green fields
- -Traditional Irish legend has it that you are invisible to leprechauns if you wear the color
- green, thereby protecting you from being pinched by one of these fairy creatures

It was believed that St. Patrick used his powers to banish all snakes from Ireland. Supposedly, he was able to chase the reptiles to the sea by standing at the top of a hill, now known as Croagh Patrick, and shooing them away with a wooden staff. Actuality, fossil records show that it was too cold for snakes to exist in Ireland. The seas around Ireland have kept snakes from making their way there. The snakes may have been a metaphor for Patrick driving the Pagans from Ireland by spreading Christianity across the country.

St. Patrick's Day falls in Lent, a holy season, a time of preparation and examination as we walk with Jesus through his final days on earth, preparing for his glorious resurrection on Easter Sunday. Many people choose Lent as a time to give up something they enjoy as a reminder of the suffering Christ went through for us. Other people add extra devotional readings or Bible study to use the 40 days to grow closer to God. Either, or both, of these can be practiced. To make the devotional time easier there will be a one sheet Lenten devotional calendar passed out on February 27. (Please let the office know if you would like a calendar and don't receive one.)

If you are interested in joining with the people at church, we will be doing a book study on the book *Mere Christianity* by C. S. Lewis beginning Ash Wednesday, March 2. The book is not one that is easily purchased so the class will be a presentation of the book with a discussion. This will take place on Wednesday evenings at 6 p.m. just before the 7 p.m. Holden Evening Prayer service. (If there is enough interest the study of *Mere Christianity* can also be broadcast on Zoom. Please let the office know if you are interested in a Zoom attendance.)



Boiler & Capital Campaign Update

If you have ventured inside the church the last few months, you have noticed the education wing and the sanctuary are toasty warm. The majority of the work on the boiler system was completed by the end of October and the boiler was turned on and tested by November 1st. As with many new ventures, we did encounter a few wrinkles in the system. Jason, who installed the system from David J. Winston & Co. was quick to figure out why the system was tripping and get us back on track. Winston has since insulated all the pretty copper pipes and added drainage pipes. The new thermostats can be programmed for each day of the week allowing the different zones to be at the temperature needed when areas are occupied or not occupied. The Property Committee is closely monitoring the gas usage compared to previous years and we hope to realize savings in this area.

A Capital Campaign is currently underway to raise funds for the costs outlaid for the new boiler system. A designated fund has been established and the current total is \$14,482. Donations are greatly appreciated. Please mark donations designated for the boiler replacement.

A rummage sale is being planned for this summer. If you are interested in joining the rummage sale committee, please contact Debbie Redditt. If you are Spring cleaning or reorganizing at home, please consider donating items to the rummage sale. Items can be stored in the upstairs classroom on the west side or larger items can be placed in classroom across from the office. Please drop off items during office hours.

Congregational Council Meeting Highlights

The Congregational Council met on February 13, 2022.

Communications:

A **thank you letter** was received and read from the **Shriners Hospital** for the donation of the Christmas poinsettias. A letter was received from **Thiel College**, thanking Immanuel for our continued generosity and support of our Endowed Fund for The Rev. Dr. William G. Leubin Scholarship. It was reported Thiel's Endowment has surpassed \$119,192,144 for Fiscal Year 2020-2021.

Immanuel will be receiving a \$300 credit from Church Mutual for our Workers Compensation premium.

The 2022 Shut-in list was updated. Please see office if you would like a copy.

Finance Committee:

The Payroll Protection Program loan appears to have been forgiven.

Council moved to designate the 2021 Quarter Sunday monies to purchase food for Immanuel's Little Food Pantry. Online giving was again researched. However, fees were 2.9% and \$.30 per transaction.

Worship & Music Committee:

A meeting is scheduled on February 15, 2022 to plan Lent season beginning March 2nd.

Pianos are being tuned in February.

Bryan has sent out the power supply part for the organ. He reports it will be either rebuilt or replaced and costs maybe upwards of \$1,500.

Stewardship Committee:

Giving envelopes for 2023 will be ordered. It was asked if the office would distribute envelopes to non-members who are consistently giving.

Christian Education Committee:

It was reported a few youth are attending Sunday School. Adult Sunday School was suspended for February. Confirmation classes are going well. It was noted Pastor should offer First Communion classes.

Social Ministry Committee:

\$160 was collected for Lutheran Response Relief. Souper Bowl monies collected totaled \$528. It was suggested to have the collection run for two weeks or for the month.

Property Committee:

Council agreed to increase Facility Usage fee for Non-Members to \$100.

Bids for 10th street rental house are being obtained for insulation, new furnace and a plumbing leak.

Water system Back flow control was tested and approved for another year.

The committee is considering future work and updates for the Powell Ave. rental.

A new Alarm Alert sensor from Church Mutual will be installed in Leubin-McCray Hall near smoke detector.

The sensor will send an alert to designated members if the smoke detector sounds when no one is on the premises. A smoke detector will be added to the kitchen as well.

Council asks the Caretaker to shovel front steps to the church as it appears to the public that we are closed. A date to reorganize the archive room and clean the classroom across from the office will be planned at the property meeting. Possible shelving may be added. **If any members have items in the classroom across from office that they want, please remove immediately or they will be disposed of on the designated cleaning day.** Property Committee is monitoring our gas usage with the installation of the new boiler. It was discovered, Immanuel had contracted in 2009 with an outsider market supplier and was over paying approximately 44% per CCF for gas usage. We opted to go back to National Fuel as our supplier, asap.

Volunteers are needed for the upcoming rummage sale. If you are interested, please contact Debbie Redditt or the church office.

Pastor's Report:

Pastor Karen reported phone calls, visits and hospital visits to members. She will send out an Easter postcard to neighbors in Lakewood community.

There is a member who lives close by church and would attend if she can get a ride. If you are able to help out, please contact Pastor Karen.

Member Sandra Miller passed away and was removed from membership.

- On their website find "customer service," then "contact us" and use the "chat" option. It's a bit tricky to find, but keep trying.
- Once you get to the automated assistant, continue to repeat your request, which soon will lead you to a live person!
- After you chat about your request, it will then be saved to your account for all future orders!


