#### A Word from Rev. Jackson

Greetings and love in the Name of our Lord Jesus Christ.

It seems appropriate that we celebrate the birthdays of two presidents this month who had a deep love for people and put it into practice. Jesus and the apostle Paul stressed over and over that love is the greatest gift of all and should be the primary indicator of our faith. ## **History Room**

"Changes are Good... Ours Were Great!"

That's the heading for the History display case, showing some of the major changes and improvements that have been made at our church. Over the years, much has been done to our building to keep it in good condition and to make it a safe and welcoming place for our church family.

Samples used went back to the 1930s, showing the formal "Ladies Parlor" with its tiled marble-like floor to new rugs and paint; the sanctuary with its traditional-formal look to the modern feel of today. The kitchen, with a wide, open ceiling and high cupboards is shown, contrasted to the new look with its modern-day appliances that meet the new safety standards. Our wiring was antique to say the least, with twist fuses now replaced by breaker boxes throughout in 2011.

Thanks to Mac MacInnes for preserving the hinges from the old Tower Door; we can appreciate the beauty of a time gone by.

As our building matures and more improvements are made, let us always have a special memory of what the building looked like then, and how we strive to preserve those feelings while meeting the needs of today's congregation.


February 14 Happy Valentine's Day; Ash Wednesday.
