
A CHRISTIAN FUNERAL SERVICE JANUARY 18, 2020

COMFORT AND ENCOURAGEMENT BEFORE THE SERVICE

Know that all of us who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death. We were therefore buried with him through Baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of God the Father, we too may live a new life. If we have been united with him in his death, we will certainly also be united with him in his resurrection. We say with Job, "The LORD gave and the LORD has taken away; may the name of the LORD be praised." Help us find comfort through the realization that we have not lost Carol but have only sent her before us to heaven. Let Carol's death remind us to be ready at all times to follow your call to depart from this world to the joys of the life to come.

Ecclesiastes 3:1-8 - Carol's bookmark was on this section of scripture.

As we begin our worship service, let us remember the good news that our sister in the one true faith, Carol Firari, is wrapped up in the loving arms of her Savior in heaven solely because of the life, death and resurrection of Jesus. So let us worship focusing our thoughts and emotions on the gospel of Christ.

Christian Funeral Worship

M: We begin this Christian funeral service for Carol Firari in the name of the Father and of the Son † and of the Holy Spirit.

M: We have come together to seek God's comfort in our sorrow and to rejoice in the promise of the resurrection. Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ, who said, "Come to me, all who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest."

Let us pray.

Lord Jesus, you wept at the grave of your friend Lazarus, and you consoled Mary and Martha in their distress. Draw near to us who mourn for Carol, and dry the tears of all who weep. Calm our troubled hearts, dispel our doubts and fears, and lead us to praise you for having brought Carol to faith. In your rising from the dead, you conquered death and opened the gates to eternal life. Strengthen us with your Word, and lead us through this earthly life until at last we are united with you and all the saints in glory everlasting.

"Abide with Me"

- 1) Abide with me; fast falls the eventide. The darkness deepens; Lord, with me abide. When other helpers fail and comforts flee, Help of the helpless, oh, abide with me!
- 5) I need thy presence ev'ry passing hour. What but thy grace can foil the tempter's pow'r? Who like thyself my guide and stay can be? Through cloud and sunshine, oh, abide with me!
- M: The Lord is the everlasting God, the Creator of the ends of the earth. He will not grow tired or weary, and his understanding no one can fathom. He gives strength to the weary and increases the power of the weak. Those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength.
- Dear friends, God did not create Adam and Eve to die. But after our first parents sinned, God said that death would come to all people. At a time like this, God speaks to our hearts. He says, "For dust you are and to dust you will return." His Scriptures also

tell us that just as sin entered the world through one man, and death through sin, in this way death came to all, because all sinned. At this moment we sense deeply the fulfillment of God's words.

- But God sent his one and only Son to become the sacrifice for the sins of the world. Christ gave himself freely into death and rose again, that all who look up to him in faith will have eternal life. In this way the Lord has had compassion on us. "For since death came through a man, the resurrection of the dead also comes through a man. For as in Adam all die, so in Christ all will be made alive." Therefore, death for the Christian is not the end of life but the beginning of eternal joy with Jesus in paradise.
- Christ was raised from the dead and became the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep. Now we know that when he returns "we will not all sleep, but we will be changed—in a flash, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trumpet. For the trumpet will sound, the dead will be raised imperishable, and we will be changed.

C: Thanks be to God! He gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ."

M: Therefore, my dear brothers and sisters, let us stand firm in the Lord and always be faithful to him in life and in death. Since all of us must appear before the judgment seat of Christ, may he teach us to number our days aright no matter how old or young we may be, that we may gain a heart of wisdom. May the favor of the Lord our God rest upon us, "for none of us lives to himself alone and none of us dies to himself alone. If we live, we live to the Lord; and if we die, we die to the Lord. So, whether we live or die, we belong to the Lord."

Proverbs 31:1-31

¹⁰ A wife of noble character who can find? She is worth far more than rubies. ¹¹ Her husband has full confidence in her and lacks nothing of value. ¹² She brings him good, not harm, all the days of her life. ¹³ She selects wool and flax and works with eager hands. ¹⁴ She is like the merchant ships, bringing her food from afar. ¹⁵ She gets up while it is still night; she provides food for her family and portions for her female servants.¹⁶ She considers a field and buys it; out of her earnings she plants a vineyard.¹⁷ She sets about her work vigorously; her arms are strong for her tasks.¹⁸ She sees that her trading is profitable, and her lamp does not go out at night. ¹⁹ In her hand she holds the distaff and grasps the spindle with her fingers.²⁰ She opens her arms to the poor and extends her hands to the needy. ²¹ When it snows, she has no fear for her household; for all of them are clothed in scarlet. ²² She makes coverings for her bed; she is clothed in fine linen and purple. ²³ Her husband is respected at the city gate, where he takes his seat among the elders of the land. ²⁴ She makes linen garments and sells them, and supplies the merchants with sashes.²⁵ She is clothed with strength and dignity; she can laugh at the days to come. ²⁶ She speaks with wisdom, and faithful instruction is on her tongue. ²⁷ She watches over the affairs of her household and does not eat the bread of idleness. ²⁸ Her children arise and call her blessed; her husband also, and he praises her: ²⁹ "Many women do noble things, but you surpass them all." ³⁰ Charm is deceptive, and beauty is fleeting; but a woman who fears the LORD is to be praised. ³¹ Honor her for all that her hands have done, and let her works bring her praise at the city gate.
