Vacancies

Grants

The following grants have been agreed:

a. Capital Grant of £2,000 to the Belbroughton Cricket Club to assist with the purchase of a specialist roller for the pitch.

b. Capital Grant of £2,000 to the Fairfield Village Hall to assist with the purchase of projection, sound and lighting systems.

c. Minor Grant of £250 to the Fairfield Community Association for assisting with planting spring bulbs and bedding plants in the village.

d. Minor Gran.t of £200 to the Fairfield Bingo Group for assisting with the purchase of a new bingo machine and buffet requirements for 2 evening sessions.

e. Minor Grant of £89 to the Wildmoor Residents Association to assist with purchasing 30mph signage for distribution to residents.

Little Bell Hall Pool – Drayton Road Belbroughton

Further works have taken place on the site to reduce the dense vegetation in and around the Belne Brook.

Fairfield Recreation Ground – Car park extension

The District Council has now confirmed to the Parish Council that it can extend the car park without the need for planning permission. Council agreed that it would now consult with the Fairfield Community Association, The Fairfield Villa Football Club and The Fairfield First School on the extension size and type of construction.

Crime Prevention - Smartwater

At its September meeting the Council is to consider whether to provide the marking kits free of charge to Belbroughton residents. In advance of that meeting it would like to hear from residents who would feel able to volunteer to assist councillors with the task of distributing these kits.
