The County Clerk-Recorder will request approval from the Board of Supervisors on Tuesday (Jun 4) morning to conduct election services for Templeton Community Services District (TCSD) (agenda item 11). Approval is for an All-Mail ballot election to be held on August 27, 2019, asking voters within the town of Templeton if they are willing to adopt a special tax to provide for 24-7 staffed Fire & Emergency Services. Arrested in Whitley Gardens

On June 28, a search for 25-year-old Daniel Jay Romo started in Templeton with a run across the freeway and sighting in the area around Templeton Middle School. Local residents were asked to stay indoors and the school board, which was in special session, sheltered in place.

On May 30, a Sheriff's K9 Deputy was in the area of Grace and Ross Drives in Whitley Gardens to respond to a sighting of the wanted felon. When the K-9 Deputy responded to a residence where Romo was suspected of hiding out, Romo once again fled from law enforcement.

Additional Deputies, County Probation Officers and a CHP helicopter immediately responded to the area. Romo was apprehended and taken into custody near the 500 block of N. Almond Drive, then booked into County Jail.

The Sheriff's Office would like to thank members of the public for getting involved and assisting Deputies with this case.

"SLO County set to extend Paso Robles groundwater restrictions"
