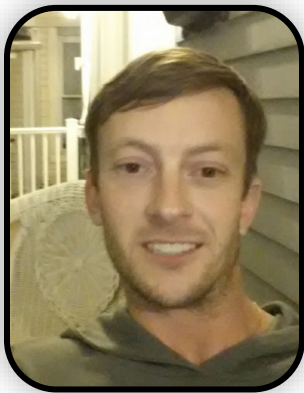
Hello Lake Forest Community!
