24<sup>th</sup> Sunday Ordinary Year B Mark 8:27-35



Jesus and his disciples set out for the villages of Caesarea Philippi. Along the way he asked his disciples, "Who do people say that I am?" They said in reply, "John the Baptist, others Elijah, still others one of the prophets." And he asked them, "But who do you say that I am?" Peter said to him in reply, "You are the Christ." Then he warned them not to tell anyone about him. He began to teach them that the Son of Man must suffer greatly and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes, and be killed, and rise after three days. He spoke this openly. Then Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him. At this he turned around and, looking at his disciples, rebuked Peter and said, "Get behind me, Satan. You are thinking not as God does, but as human beings do." He summoned the crowd with his disciples and said to them, "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me. For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake and that of the gospel will save it."

Dear St Pius And St Anthony Churches,

24<sup>th</sup> Sunday Ordinary Time Year B Mark 8:27-35

Who is Jesus? How do we think of Him? Today's gospel presents two questions 1) "Who do people say 'I am'? (Mark 8:27) *and then* the more personal question to the apostles 2) "Who do **YOU** say that I am?" (Mark 8:29). How would YOU answer Jesus? How do you see Him? How do you interact with Him daily? As a part of your life, how would you describe Jesus to someone who asked you who He is? I compare this encounter between Jesus and His apostles to that 'defining moment' in a relationship between husband and wife, parent and child or among close friends, when one person says to the other, "What do I mean to you?" That is Serious! Think before responding, right? We are careful & thoughtful about our words that follow because the emotional stakes are so high. So, how do we answer Jesus?

It may be a shock to some of us to read about the following heated exchange between Jesus and Peter. Peter first presumptuously 'rebukes' Jesus and tells Him what kind of Savior He should be (Mark 8:32). Then, Jesus returns a rebuke to Peter, (Mark 8:33), calling Peter to think of his own subordinate position (as a disciple-follower), for Peter to know his own place. Two things are happening in Peter's response: 1) Peter is trying to 'revise' God's will of sending Jesus as a 'Suffering Savior' (Peter wants all glory and fireworks) yet Peter is also 2) affronting the personal dignity of Jesus as an individual child of God. We do this to one another, when we do not accept the other person for who they are: when we try to make them into what WE want them to be, instead of accepting them as God created them. We must be humble as we stand before the mystery of another person in his/her individual uniqueness as created by God. God alone knows the inmost depths of the other person and their fulfillment. Each person has been uniquely created in the image/likeness of God-He knows each one (Genesis 1:27 & John 10:14). So, we cannot presumptively stamp our own preferences upon them (God has already done that-His image/likeness on their soul). When Peter tries telling Jesus here, how to be a Savior, Peter is stepping over a line (out of line) and Jesus reminds him of his presumptive overreach. Jesus says, "Get behind me, Satan" (Mark 8:33). Imagine the formation of a leader walking in front of a group moving forward. Basically by Peter presuming to tell Jesus how He should serve God, Peter was stepping out around Jesus (out-flanking Him) to assume the lead role over Jesus. So, Jesus says, 'Get back in line, get back behind me in formation'. Again, for Peter to presume to tell anybody how he/she should serve God would be an offense against that individual person's dignity, but all the more so with Jesus (who would presume to tell God how to be God?). Maybe a better question to Peter for today's gospel is "Who does Peter think He is, telling God how to act?" As Jesus often does, He turns the table on Peter. Peter may think proudly that he has given Jesus aa new name identifying him as 'Messiah' and it turns out that Peter gets the name-title 'Satan' by his arrogant attempt to control Jesus! The word 'Satan' used here is not used like a proper noun (Peter is not THE Devil), but rather that title is used to describe Peter's 'satanic' or 'oppositional-to-Jesus' actions. This same type naming action happens when a basketball player sinks a half-court shot, and someone yells, "You Ace!" Well, the player is not actually a star jet-pilot, it is just that they just happened to control the air to land that 3-point shot! The player's skill action is what is being described: their proper name is not 'Ace'. So, the same with Peter here. He is not the 'Satan', but he is accusing, detracting and opposing God's will (Satan in Hebrew means 'Adversary'-'Opposer'). Interestingly, when Jesus asks Peter who Peter thinks Jesus is, Peter turns out to reveal his own self- his biases/ prejudices. Jesus does that! He cuts to the core. Our interactions with Him, reveal to ourselves who we are!

So what do we say? When Jesus asks us how we view Him, He is inviting us to imitate His humility. Jesus tells us, 'Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me' (Mark 8:34). To deny oneself and take up one's cross, means that we serve and place others ahead of ourselves (that is discipleship by example). We do not presume to know what is best for everybody else, and tell them how they are to be themselves (if we did, we would only be making them 'little me's of me' instead of letting them be what God has created them to be (and for them to flourish as God intended for them). Part of denying oneself, also means that we often do not know what is good for our own selves either. So we need to turn to God for our own fulfillment. In St Augustine's autobiography Confessions, he humbly admits that humanly he does not know God, and does not even not know his own self. In Book 10 of the Confessions, St Augustine realizes that he doesn't know himself; only God knows him through and through. He asks, "What then am I, O my God? Of what nature am I?" (Book 10:17ff). St Augustine discovers that God is more interior to him, than even his own self, when he writes, "You were more inward to me than my most inward part and higher than my highest' (Book 3.6ff). So, we must go to God to discover ourselves. How presumptuous it would be of us to define ourselves or self-identify based on today's desires and fashions. Jesus is our 'Way, Truth and Life' (Jn 14:6). We must humble ourselves, and take up Jesus' cross to discover who we are!
