Program: Sandwich by Rita Belsom



Rita Belsom's beautiful collection of Crystal Sandwich shown above includes a few pieces in green. There were 3 companies that produced Sandwich plus reproductions: Anchor Hocking (1939-1943), Indiana Glass (1920-1980), Duncan Miller (1924-1955). And Indiana Glass produced Tiara, something close to Sandwich in 1980. Her collection includes mixing bowls, custard dishes with ruffled edge, sugar & creamers, custard footed dish with straight edge, plates (center flowers vary as do the edges), oval vegetable bowl, butter dish, cookie jar, stem ware, flat glasses, cruets, candle sticks, and more. The deep green pieces are from her 99 1/2 year old aunt.

More information on Tracy Lange's Degenhart glass heart from the February Show & Tell:

Degenhart is the name used by collectors for the products of the Crystal Art Glass Company of Cambridge, Ohio. The Degenharts started the glassworks in 1947. Quality paperweights and other glass objects were made in over 145 colors. The molds were sold in 1978. The D in a heart trademark was removed at this time, so collectors can easily recognize original Degenhart pieces.
