#### I Am What I Am

"God doesn't call the qualified; he qualifies the called," a quote I see frequently. Each of today's readings has someone being called to do something for which they feel unworthy. Rarely do three readings align so well as these three do. While usually Peter is my guy – the one whose actions and words speak to me most poignantly - today, it is Paul's words that resonate: "By the grace of God I am what I am" and who he was, as who we all are, is who God calls.

Make no mistake – we are all being called. I have been a catechist for almost 30 years. During that time, I have responded to many calls, not always willingly, sad to say. Other times, I have done the 'calling.' When initially approached for ministry, most respond: "Me? No way. I am not holy enough, worthy enough, don't know enough. I can't do that." Neither am I holy enough, worthy enough, know enough. And yet here I am, 30 years in.

By the grace of God, we are all who we are, and in the eyes of the God who created us, it is enough. Would that we thought the same. As part of the Body of Christ, all have a role. Paul, in another letter to the Corinthians, notes that just as the ear can't do what the foot does, nor the eye what the mouth does, each member of the Body of Christ does what only she/ he will do – a task left undone if we don't do it. This can burden us with anxiety ... or arrogance ... but doesn't change the fact.



Since God calls us to it, God will qualify us to do it. God asks of us only what God knows we can, through his grace, accomplish. Years ago, a visiting priest said in his homily: "God doesn't ask us to be successful, God simply asks us to do." A consoling sentiment then, I have thought of it often since. Thank God God doesn't ask us to be successful, because often I have not been particularly successful — if I look at success as I understand that word.

The words of a *Prayer for Those in Ministry* spring to mind: "We cannot do everything, and there is a sense of

liberation in realizing that. This enables us to do something and do it very well. It may be incomplete, but it is a beginning, a step along the way, an opportunity for the Lord's grace to enter and do the rest. We may never see the end results, but that is the difference between the master builder and the worker. We are workers, not master builders; ministers, not messiahs. We are prophets of a future not our own."

Isaiah, Paul and Peter. Three people who responded to God's call, neither of whom saw the task of building the kingdom complete upon their death. Neither, I expect, will we. Nevertheless, "here I am; send me."





#### MEDICALLY ASSISTED DEATH AND CHALLENGES TO A GOOD DEATH

With the legalization of Medical Assistance in Dying, we are invited as Roman Catholic Christians to give serious consideration to what we believe about death and dying. The Church holds the underlying principle of Choose Life among all others. We recognize the question of medically assisted suicide is a multifaceted one with no easy answers and believe therefore it is important to have dialogue about this.

Dr. Nuala Kenny, as the past Ethics and Health Policy Advisor for the Catholic Health Alliance of Canada has been at the forefront of this conversation. In her book, Rediscovering the Art of Dying she addresses the ultimate medicalization of human suffering presented by medically assisted death, and expresses concern about society's increasing inability to accompany others toward a good death.

On Sunday, March 10<sup>th</sup> Dr. Kenny will be in our archdiocese to present on the impact of the legalization of Medical Assistance in Dying. As a medical doctor, medical ethicist, Professor Emeritus of Dalhousie University, Sister of Charity and author of over one hundred and eighty papers and four books, Dr. Kenny is nationally recognized as an educator and physician ethicist and travels extensively as a distinguished lecturer. We are delighted to welcome her for this workshop which will take place at St. Bernard's Church Hall, Botsford Street, from 2:00 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. Cost is \$15, which includes supper.


# COMMUNAL CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENT OF THE ANOINTING OF THE SICK
