



FROM THE VICAR

Dear Members of Trinity,

I pray that all of you are doing well! This month, we will be discussing the Fifth Commandment:

You shall not murder.

What does this mean?

We should fear and love God so that we do not hurt or harm our neighbor in his body but help, and support him in every physical need.

Life is our most valuable earthly possession and in order to safeguard our body and life, God gave us the 5th commandment to protect human life. The Bible recognizes three basic types of murder:

- 1. **Literal Murder**: where human life is taken by hand, word, or deed (Gen 4:8; 2 Sam 11:15; Ex 21:29; Mt 27:5).
- 2. **Indirect Murder**: where one plots or contributes to take another person's life (Gen 37:17-35). Or by causing another person bodily harm (Jn 18:10).
- 3. **Figurative Murder**: where one neglects to help or support others in need. Or when someone neglects to help another person out of hatred for that person (Lk 10:31-32; Mt 5:21-22; 1 Jn 3:15; Gen 4:5-7).

However, God does not consider all acts of killing as acts of murder. For example, accidental deaths, taking an enemy soldier's life during war, and legitimate self-defense are not acts of murder. In addition, capital punishment upon murderers and other violent criminals, is not an act of murder because God has delegated His authority to punish evildoers to the civil authorities who rule over us (Gen 9:6; Romans 13:4).

Although we may not actually commit the physical act of murder, we still break this commandment when we hate our neighbor in our hearts. According to Scripture, "Everyone who hates his brother is a murderer," since the root of murder originates from the heart overcome by anger (1 Jn 3:15). Because God equates hatred to murder, "everyone who is angry with his brother will be liable to judgment" (Mt 5:21-26).

In keeping this commandment, we should allow no one to suffer harm, but to show them kindness and love. This is accomplished when we show love, even to our enemies and to those who give us reason to be angry. Albrecht Peters explains,

> God is not satisfied when we merely withhold our hand from committing homicide; He demands "a patient, mild heart," not only when dealing with a friend but also when dealing with an enemy. God is not satisfied when we merely do not damage our neighbor in his bodily existence; rather, He wants us to "show him all good and love" in every situation of need in his life

(Peters, Ten Commandments, 216).

By showing love and kindness toward our enemies, God wants to remind us to remember the First Commandment, that He is our God, the One who wishes to help, comfort, and protect us, so that He may restrain our desire for revenge.
