## EXHIBITOR INFORMATION

### **ALL FRIESIAN & PART-BRED FRIESIAN OWNERS, AND HORSES MUST BE MEMBERS OF IFSHA**

Owners must be IFSHA Members @ \$85.00 per owner, Annual Fee  
Horse must be IFSHA Members @ \$30.00 per horse Annual Fee  
IFSHA Non-Member Non-Owner Fee (Adult) @ \$35.00 per adult non-owner  
IFSHA Non-Member Non\_Owner Fee (Junior) \$20.00 per Junior non-owner  
USEF Fee  
USEF Single Event Show Pass @ \$45.00 per person if applicable  
USDF Non-Member Fee \$35.00 if applicable

**ENTRIES CLOSE** August 14, 2019. Entries postmarked later than August 14th will be charged a post entry fee of \$20.00, per horse. Post entries must be in the show office by the close of the previous session. See page for fee schedule. \$20.00 Office fee per Horse, academy horse's will not be charged an office fee.

**Refunds:** All entries and stall fees will be refunded on request prior to the closing date for entries (August 14, 2019). After this date, refunds will be made upon verification of a bona fide injury to horse, exhibitor or exhibitor's family, received or postmarked no later than August 14, 2019. Stall fees are not refundable.

Management reserves the right to refuse a Post entry in classes where additional entry would make it necessary to split the class.

Management reserves the right to cancel, combine or divide any class where it is deemed advisable and to reschedule any divided class. Entries must be made before the close of the previous session. A class may be cancelled at the beginning of session due to insufficient entries at the time.

Management reserves the right to decline any entry and to return any entry fees before of during a show without being liable for compensation.

Management requests exhibitors to comply with GR1211 regarding "SHARPS." Failure to do so will result in a fine.

An agent may make entries for more than one owner, but each owner must be on a separate signed entry blank.

Entries payable in U.S. funds only. A \$25 fee will be charged for returned checks and for exhibitors who fail to pay their fees before leaving the show.

**Sharps:** Management requests that exhibitors comply with USEF Rule GR 1210 regarding "SHARPS." Failure to do so will result in a fine.

**Adult Riders** and drivers in amateur classes must have a current amateur card in their possession or make application for one at the Horse Show Office at least one hour prior to the class.

**Novice Classes** are open to exhibitors or horse who have not won three first place ribbons at a Regular, NEHC member show or shows sanctioned by UPHA. The status of any Novice is as of the closing date of entries for any particular recognized competition. Ribbons won within one breed do not count in reckoning novice status to another (e.g. Saddlebred to Morgan). Within a breed, ribbons won in driving do not count in reckoning novice status in riding classes and vice versa (e.g. Morgan Pleasure Driving to Pleasure Saddle).

Amateur Classes are not restricted to exhibitors 18 and over unless indicated in the Prize List.

If a Division has a Junior Exhibitor section it is expected that they will show in the section.

**Morgan Entries.** Horses shown in this division must be registered with the American Morgan Horse Association Inc., or an organization having registry reciprocity, (Canadian Morgan Horse Association, British Morgan Horse Society, Swedish Morgan Horse Society). Horses must be entered under their full registered name or if under one year of age be eligible for registration. Horses must be entered under the names of the owner(s) or lessee of record. A copy of the registration papers showing recorded ownership or proof of lease must be submitted with entry form at the time of making entry. Competition management is responsible for notifying exhibitors of this requirement.

**Saddlebred Entries.** A copy of registration papers showing proof of ownership or a copy of the registration papers with a Certificate of Eligibility to show issued by the American Saddlebred Registry must be submitted be presented to the horse show office before a competition number will be released. Owners and trainers must be members of ASHA. Membership applications will be available in the horse show office.

**Health Requirements:** The Dept. of Public Health requires that all horses provide a copy of a negative Coggins test for E.I.A. dated within 6 months of the show date for out of state entries; 12 months for Mass. Horses and a certificate to prove the Eastern and Western Equine Encephalitis vaccination has been administered. All horses will be required to have a Health Certificate. Horses stabled in the state of Massachusetts must have a current health certificate dated after January 1, 2019. Out of state horses must

have a health certificate dated within 30 days. Arrival time for horses and campers is Wednesday, August 22 after 8:00 am. There is no setting up before 8am on Wednesday.

The **Coliseum** will be available on Friday , August 22 after 8:00 am until 10:00 pm.

**Stabling:** Entries wishing to be stabled together must indicate so on each individual's stabling list and entry blank by using farm or individual's name on the entry blank.

**Stalls with doors** are available at \$120.00. **NO INITIAL BEDDING.** Exhibitors will be held responsible for the condition of the stalls. Eastern States conducts inspections to insure that the stalls remain in the condition in which they were found. Stall doors may not be removed for any reason.

**Campers:** Limited camper parking is available.

**Fire & Safety Regulations:** The following must be adhered to in accordance with the Town of West Springfield Fire Regulations and Public Safety Codes. **NO SMOKING** in the barns or in the coliseum. All fabrics used as backdrops and/or table coverings must be flame retardant. Use of spray flame retardants is acceptable. Burlap material is not allowed as back drop or table covering. Fine bark mulch and corn stalks are not allowed for display materials. Large wood chips or coarse bark mulch may be used in barns but shall be kept damp at all times. Flammable liquids and gases (Propane

cylinders) are not allowed in buildings. Non-flammable gas cylinders, like helium, shall be supported by metal stands. Devices utilizing open flames are not allowed. No motorized gasoline/diesel vehicles allowed: scooters/golf carts. No large round or square bales of hay or straw and/or open piles of silage or haylage are allowed. Feed and bedding material is not allowed on the floor or any aisle for display purposes, including wood shavings, sawdust, peat moss, loose straw. No excessive accumulation of litter or rubbish allowed. Coverings are not allowed over aisles- banners, farm signs, pop-up tents. All exits shall remain free and clear at all times. All fire lanes shall remain free and clear at all times. All fire alarm pull stations and any other fire protection equipment shall be free and clear of obstructions and readily visible. All aisles shall be a minimum 10 feet in width and shall remain free and clear at all times. Aisle display width are not to exceed 30" from each side in main aisle and 24" from each side in side aisles. All fire extinguishers shall be accessible at all times. No signs, decorations or products shall be attached to any part of any sprinkler system.

**Mulch** Large wood chips or coarse bark mulch may be used **IN BARN**s but must be kept damp at all times.

**Footing:** The Coliseum ring is 100' x 200' with dirt footing. Warm-up rings are 40' x 100' and 40' x 120' with all weather surfaces composed of limestone and sand.

**Dogs** are not permitted on the show grounds unless restrained with a leash. A \$50 fine will be charged for the return of any dog found loose on the show grounds. Exhibitors are expected to clean up after their dogs, particularly in areas adjacent to campers and food service facilities.

**Motor Vehicles:** Only Golf Carts and Mopeds are allowed on the ESE grounds and driver must have a valid driver's license to operate these vehicles. Children 12 and under must wear a helmet when riding a bicycle on the grounds. The show committee, its agents and employees assume no responsibility for accidents occurring to any exhibitor, groom, attendant, animal or equipment at the show. The Show Committee assumes no responsibility for loss or destruction or any property, equipment or damages to or by animals exhibiting at the show while on the grounds or stabling area.

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent(s), legal guardian(s), or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Chapter 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

**POLICY FOR REQUESTING HOLDS:** Holds will be granted at the discretion of the Director of Operations. They must be requested before the start of each session. Management will try to cooperate with an exhibitor requesting a hold, but will not be responsible if a hold is not honored. If a hold is granted, the in-gate will be held for two minutes, then open for two minutes before the class is closed.

**Prize Money will be mailed out to exhibitors within 30 days following the show. Six ribbons will be awarded in all classes.**

**USEF RULES COMMON TO ALL USEF SHOWS**

**GR828.4 General Eligibility**

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Preliminary Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$30 Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) lead line; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

**GR916 General Conditions**

Except as permitted by the FEI for FEI recognized classes, all entries at a Licensed Competition must be on the same basis. A competition cannot give free or reduced entries, free or reduced transportation or other expenses to one exhibitor unless the same privileges are extended to all exhibitors in the same section or subset of competitors. The requirements to obtain these

privileges must be advertised to all potential exhibitors. No fees may be imposed that are not listed in the prize list.

### **Federation Entry Agreement**

By entering a Federation-licensed Competition and signing the entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaultor or Longeur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of The United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (The "Federation") and the local rules of the Competition. I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation and of the Competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the Competition, the Federation, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the Rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered. I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the Competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cable-casts, broadcasts, internet, film, new media or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the Competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the Competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise any product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocable waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation. The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State, See GR 908.4. "EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT FEDERATION RULE BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH."

### **GR1307 AMATEUR STATUS**

Only active Federation members may obtain amateur status. Every person who has reached his/her 18th birthday and competes in classes for amateurs under Federation rules must possess current amateur status issued by the Federation (Exception: This is not required for Opportunity classes). This status must be available for inspection or the competitor must have lodged with the competition secretary, as least one hour prior to such class, an application for such status provided by the Federation, Amateur status will be issued only on receipt of the application properly signed and is revocable at any time for cause. Any person who has not reached his/her 18th birthday is an amateur and does not require amateur status.

Appropriate protective boots and half-cup blinkers WILL BE PERMITTED in exercise areas. These shows will be conducted in observance of the underlying principles of the Federal Horse Protection Act as well as the published U.S.D.A. Guidelines.

SUBCHAPTER FR-9 DRESSAGE SUITABILITY FR144 General 1. All horses must adhere to rules in Subchapter FR1-General Qualifications. 2. In the lineup, horses must stand quietly and may be asked to back individually or as a group. 3. To be eligible for the Amateur Dressage Suitability class, **a horse must not have shown in licensed Dressage competitions/Tests at Second level or above, either domestically or**



**abroad or been entered and shown in a Dressage Hack Class with the same rider.** 4. To be eligible for the Open Dressage Suitability class, a horse shall not have shown in licensed Dressage competitions/Tests at Second level or above, either domestically or abroad or been entered and shown in any Dressage Hack Class. 6. Refer to Chapter DR-Dressage Division for directives in performance and judging, including DR101-Object and General Principles, DR102-107-Gaits and Transitions, DR115-Collection, DR116-The Submission, The Impulsion, and DR117-The Position and Aids of the Rider.

## **DEFINITIONS**

**Amateur Classes** shall be limited to individuals 18 years and older as of Dec 1 of the previous year unless otherwise stated in the class description.

**Master Classes** are open to exhibitors age 50 and over as of Dec 1 of the previous year.

**Youth Classes** are open to exhibitors 21 years of age and under as of Dec 1 of the previous year. Exhibitors in Youth classes are permitted to show a stallion.

**Junior Exhibitors** Classes are open to exhibitors under 18 years of age as of Dec 1 of the previous year.

**Ladies Classes** shall be limited to ladies 18 years and older as of Dec 1 of the previous year unless otherwise stated in the class description.

**Maiden Horse:** A horse that has not yet won one (1) blue ribbon in a USEF regular member show IN THE DIVISION ENTERED.

**Novice Horse:** A horse that has not yet won three (3) blue ribbons in a USEF regular member show IN THE DIVISION ENTERED.

**Limit Horse:** A horse that has not yet won six (6) blue ribbons in a USEF regular member show IN THE DIVISION ENTERED.

**Junior Horse:** A horse 4 years old and under as of Jan 1 of the current year.

**Maiden Rider/Driver:** A rider/driver who has not yet won one (1) blue ribbon in ANY saddle / driving class, regardless of division, at a USEF regular member show.

**Novice Rider/Driver:** A rider/driver who has not yet one three (3) blue ribbons in ANY saddle/ driving class, regardless of division at a USEF regular member show.

**Limit Rider/Driver:** A rider/driver who has not yet won six (6) ANY saddle/driving class, regardless of division, at a USEF regular member show.

To enter any championship class, you must have entered, shown, and been judged in the qualifying class noted in parenthesis (X).

### FRIESIAN DIVISION

All Friesian classes will accept only purebred FPS/FHANA, FHS/FPZV Friesians. or IFSHA certified/registered Friesians. Each animal must show proof of registry. Friesian owners should refer to and follow Friesian rules posted on [www.usef.org](http://www.usef.org).

## **REGION 1 FRIESIAN IN HAND CLASSES**

Entries are to be judged individually, standing then at a walk and trot on the line. Entries will be judged 40% on conformation (presence, quality, type) and 60% on natural movement of the horse. No more than two handlers shall be allowed in the ring. One whip per handler is allowed.

### Walk Trot Division

**83. Region 1 Champion Friesian Green Horse Pleasure - Walk Trot** Open to horses that have never been shown in a class requiring a canter or lope in any recognized show. Horse may not have won three first place ribbons at a rated show. May be shown Saddle Seat, Hunt Seat or Western. To be shown at a walk, trot or jog. To be judged on movement natural to the horse, performance, presence, quality, type, conformation and manners.

**102. Region 1 Champion Friesian Walk Trot Amateur** May be shown English or Western. Open to amateur riders of any age. Horse may not have cantered or loped at a rated show OR rider may not have cantered or loped at a rated show. To be shown at a walk and trot or jog both ways of the ring. To be judged on, manners, presence, performance and quality.

**153. Region 1 Champion Friesian Walk Trot Jr. Exhibitor**

**156. Region 1 Champion Friesian Walk Trot Pleasure** May be shown English or Western. Open to riders of any age. Horse may not have cantered or loped at a rated show OR rider may not have cantered or loped at a rated show. To be shown at a walk, trot or jog, and canter or lope both ways of the ring. To be judged on performance, manners, presence and quality.

**40. Region 1 Champion Friesian Walk Trot Novice Horse**

### All Seat Division

**139. Region 1 Champion Friesian Pleasure Amateur ( All Seats)**

May be shown English or Western. Open to amateur riders of any age. To be shown at a walk and trot or jog both ways of the ring. To be judged on, manners, presence, performance and quality

### **Misc Division**

**111. Region 1 Champion Friesian Liberty:\*\*** +This class demonstrates the beauty and elegance of the style and movement that is natural to the particular Friesian Horse. Horses to be judged on movement ,style, type, and quality. Consideration is to be given to how the horse performed during his exhibition. Horses willing to “show off” and keep moving with moderate encouragement from the exhibitor and helper are preferred over those that need constant pushing from the exhibitor and helper. The horse should give the impression that he/she is enjoying their Liberty class time, not so much that he/she is being forced to perform. **GYPSY HORSE DIVISION**

The show is open to any Gypsy type horse registered in a purebred studbook of any one of the registries: GVHS, GCDHA, GHA, GHRA. A copy of the registration must be submitted with entry.

**1. Gypsy Horse in Hand** A. Halter classes are designed to evaluate the quality of breeding animals to encourage improvement of the breed.

B. Horses will be viewed from the front, rear, and side and judged on Type, Conformation, Way of Going, Quality and Presence

C. Horses are to be shown square The front legs should be on a vertical line directly under the shoulder. The back of the hocks should be in a vertical line with the animal's buttocks. At no time should the horse be stretched or parked.

D. Horses will enter the ring at a walk to the judge. When passing the judge, engage a trot for approximately 50', turn at a 90 degree angle and continue trotting for approximately 50' to allow judge the opportunity to see the trot from inline and the side angle. Line up as indicated by the ringmaster. Entries will be examined by the judge in the line up after all horses have been worked.

E. Gaits

1. The walk should be a natural flat-footed, four beat gait. The walk will be alert, with a stride of reasonable length for the size of the horse.

2. The trot should be a smooth, ground covering, two beat diagonal gait, with a slight flick of feather at the point of extension. The trot should be square and balanced with straight forward movement of the feet.

F. A horse may be shown clipped or unclipped, neither being penalized. Horses may be body clipped or shown in full coat. A small bridle path is also acceptable.

G. Horses must be serviceably sound, in good condition and well groomed. Judges may check teeth.

H. Appropriate dress does not include shorts, t shirts, sandals, slip on or open toed shoes. Attire for Halter classes is varied, but must be clean, neat and professional. Hats and gloves are optional.

I. Exhibitors may use any type of halter that compliments the horse. It should be well fitting safe halter, and can be of any type material. No knotted rope type training halters are allowed. A flat chain lead with the chain across or under the nose is permissible. A bridle with a bit is also acceptable.

**22. Gypsy Open Walk Trot Pleasure**

**51. Gypsy Open Walk Trot Pleasure Championship (22)**

All under saddle classes are to be judged on performance, manners, and way of going. The breed can vary in movement. All are correct as long as the movement is clean and straight, and they do a true walk and trot on a light rein with no gaiting, racking, or pacing. Excessive speed or slowness will be penalized. ## **ACADEMY DIVISION RULES USE ACADEMY/NON USEF ENTRY FORM**

Riders in this division are students who are currently taking riding lessons and are to be judged on their basic riding skills. The age of the rider must be listed on the entry blank. Headers for Lead Line riders must be at least 18 years of age. Horses that are used are to be LESSON HORSES. Horses are not to be judged (See Horse Eligibility). Class splits will be made at the manager's discretion. There will be minimum holds allowed, please be prepared to enter the ring when the class is called. There will be a 2 minute gate call per class

**Ride Eligibility:** A rider MAY NOT enter in any other division at the show. A rider who has shown in a regular division class or in a full riding suit at any show is prohibited from participating further in the Academy Division, with the exception of the Show Rider Classes. Once a rider has competed at ANY level wearing a full suit, they are ineligible to compete in Academy classes at any point thereafter. The rider can however compete in Show Rider Classes in the season(s) following the season in which the rider showed wearing a full suit.

**Horse Eligibility:** Academy mounts must be Lesson Horses. A Lesson Horse is a horse or pony that is REGULARLY used in a lesson program to teach a number of different riders in any given week. Braiding is optional. There are no shoeing restrictions. Protective boots are permissible. Horses may cross-enter from the regular horse show to Academy classes, provided these horses are School Horses as defined above. Academy mounts may be shown in a snaffle bridle (martingales allowed), Pelham, or full bridle. This division is open to all breeds of horses and ponies.

**Attire:** Helmets approved for horseback riding (not bicycle helmets) are MANDATORY for all exhibitors. Riders must wear appropriate boots.

**Saddle Seat:** Kentucky Jodhpurs, boots, shirt, and tie. Vest and gloves are optional. NO riding coats or derbies are allowed.

**Hunt Seat:** Hunter style jodhpurs, jodhpur boots or paddock boots, shirt and tie or choker, and helmets. Adults may wear breeches and boots. NO riding coats or derbies are allowed.

**Western Seat:** Western jeans or slim-fitting pants, long-sleeve shirt. Ties and chaps are optional. NO western hats are allowed. Will split classes if sufficient entries.
