The only Contest that was sent to State Grange in 2020 was the "Quilt Blocks". That was because they use the blocks to make the quilt for the State Grange Family Activities raffle. At the State Grange level, they did judge the blocks. Berks County received two places: 2<sup>nd</sup> place went to Jane Reppert and 3<sup>rd</sup> place went to Dianne Geschwindt (both from Virginville Grange).

Here are a few tips to improve your health:

- 1. Deep Breathing: Deep breathing is a simple way to improve your health without spending any money. When we are tense or stressed, we often breathe very shallow. Try taking deep breaths, this is a great way to help your body to relax and calm our nervous systems. This is sometimes more difficult than it sounds though, so focusing on slow, steady, deep breaths will be helpful.
- 2. Sleep: Your might feel you need to be doing something active to achieve better health, rather than stopping to rest. Sleep is the body's time to focus on repair and recharging. When it comes to improving our health, sleep is huge but easy to overlook. We know how important adequate sleep is, but we often stay up later than we should.
- 3. Washing Hands: Sing "Happy Birthday" twice while you scrub your hands. That's how long it takes to wash away the germs that can cause colds and flu.

Do you color hard boiled eggs for Easter? Do you know how old the eggs in your refrigerator are? Here is a way to tell: Place the egg in a pan of cold water, if it lies on its side, it is fresh – if it tilts on an angle, its approximately 3-4 days old – if it stands upright, it is probably about 10 days – if it floats on the top, it is old and should not be used.

If you color eggs and want to do a Natural Dye, here are the items to use for the various colors:

<u>Lavender</u> Purple grape juice <u>Brown</u> Strong coffee

GreenSpinach leaves - boiledOrangeYellow onion skins - BoiledYellowGround turmeric - boiledPinkBeets or cranberry juiceRedLots of red onion skins - boiled

Lots of red onion skins - boiled

Blue Canned blueberries or red cabbage leaves

Light Yellow Orange or lemon peels, carrot tops, celery seed or ground cumin



Instructions: Put the eggs in a single layer in a pan and pour water in until the eggs are covered. Then add a teaspoon of vinegar. Add the natural dye items to eggs, bring water to a boil then reduce heat and simmer 15 minutes. Remove eggs with a slotted spoon and put them in a glass bowl. Use caution, the eggs will be very hot. Refrigerate. (If you would like a deeper color, cool entire contents of natural dye and eggs in refrigerator overnight.)

## AGRICULTURE REPORT by Doug Sattazahn

We will soon be at one year of COVID-19 upending our everyday lives. Agriculture has felt varying effects through the pandemic with a host of government relief programs responding to provide aid. The Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) came first to provide a loan to businesses to help keep employees on the payroll. This program offered loan forgiveness and has been renewed several times to cover all the businesses that wanted to sign up. There has even been a second round for additional funding to companies that signed up the first round. Then the Coronavirus Food Assistance Program (CFAP) was approved to pay farmers directly for losses due to market disruptions. Like the PPP, there was also a second round of CFAP payments, and will be another in the future.

The challenges of the past year could not be predicted, but government aid was plentiful to make up the loss of farm income. Commodity prices have rebounded nicely as we move into 2021. Hopefully the pandemic will soon be in the rear-view mirror and the free market can resume normally!

#### POMONA GRANGE HIGHLIGHTS

Since there was no December Pomona meeting, the following items were taken care of by the President and the Executive Committee:

- 1) It was approved to renew our web-site invoice Jennifer received.
- 2) The Officer Bond for officers and members handling funds for the Pomona (coverage \$100,000) was approved at a cost of \$189. The amount was dropped from the \$250,000.00 that was previously held.
- 3) Approved payment of invoice regarding the typesetting and payment of the Pomona 2021 calendars.
