# **Colonial Acres Phase V Meeting Minutes 12.13.2017**

#### Call to order

C. Christianson called to order the regular meeting of the Colonial Acres Phase V, Inc. at 6:05 pm on 12/13/2017at CAV clubhouse.

Roll Call All present except B. Charles who was excused.

**Approval of minutes from last meeting-** Approved – available in Newsletter.

#### Financial Report for November 2017 – Jim Reuschlein

J. Reuschlein gave the financial report for November and the report was approved.

# Management Report - Jim Reuschlein, Clearview Property Management Services

The Rules and Regulations were updated to address ongoing issues with unregistered and inoperable vehicles.

Maintenance of wood on building exterior siding is costing more and more each year. — The savings long term if replaced with vinyl siding. Would require a contract and pay a down payment of \$200,000. Every unit in the community would pay within 9 months each month an additional \$450.00, or \$50.00 per month. If the member pays this amount before April 1, 2018 they will receive a \$25.00 discount. Wood buildings with sunrooms would pay an additional \$1,000 or \$111.11 a month. Prepaid accounts will receive a discount. If the member pays this amount before April 1, 2018 they will receive an additional \$25.00 discount.

Discussion: C. Christianson communicated that the property/board has been working on this for a long time. This topic has been reviewed over the years and if we would have done the project in 2006 we would have saved half of the amount of the cost we are now having to pay.

Current cost of wood is costing everyone 10% of your carrying cost. The expectation is to pay off the loan with money from the existing carrying charges. A member said that they live in a vinyl building and do not think they should have to pay for wood buildings. It was explained that they are currently paying for the increasing cost of replacing and repairing the wood buildings. It was also explained that sharing costs is part of living in a Cooperative. A Member asked if anyone on the Board or the management company had an identity of interest with the contractor. The answer was no. A member asked what the life expectancy of the vinyl siding was. 40 plus years.

Out of the 42 members present overwhelmingly the membership was in favor of moving forward with the project.

The motion to move forward with the siding project was unanimously approved (including B. Charles).

Dick Biskner informed people that soliciting is still happening, but you do not have to tolerate it. Call the police as I did on a man wanting to know if I am buying windows. The police came, ticketed him and it was done.

Adjournment C. Christianson adjourned the meeting at 6:53 pm.

As we begin the new year how about a resolution to become more involved in our Colonial Acres community by participating in meetings or maybe even lending your talents by volunteering? We are very welcoming.



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Your 2018 Resolution: Get Up and Get Out It's a new year. And, if you want to consider a 2018 getaway as more than just a stroll to the pool starting Memorial Day, you may want to step out of your comfort zone and look at the following quick, easy ways to enjoy your time in Michigan when it's warm again.

And believe it or not, this is the time for you to climb out of hibernation mode and start searching for a way to take yourselves and/or the grandkids out on a mini adventure or two that may be a step or two out of your comfort zone. It'll also be a way to get the grandkids away from their videogame controllers and phone screens to discover there is life beyond being plugged in 24/7. A real one, in fact. And, it's a way for you to rediscover and plug back in to the outdoors, and life outside Colonial Acres. The reason I'm talking about this in winter is that many campgrounds and such book early, beginning now, at least six months away from warm weather. The busiest fill quickly, so the faster you get going, the more likely you'll be successful, and on the way to reawakening your adventurous spirit.

#### Here are some ideas:

--You may not know that you don't have to go camping to stay at most Michigan state parks and recreation areas. That includes some nearby like Brighton and Pinckney recreation areas, as well as some city parks.

For instance, go to Pinckney Recreation Area

and rent a cabin on Bruin Lake, near Gregory, about 20 miles southwest of your recliner. Your cabin is typical of what's available statewide, with two bedrooms furnished with bunk beds and a double bed, along with a small kitchen with microwave, fridge and coffee maker, and of course that all-important fire ring outside for evening campfires and marshmallow roasting. That also means bring a grill. Or, inquire if there is one adjacent, so all you need is charcoal. Or, take'em out to some of the area's nearby restaurants, including those at Hamburg—yes, you can buy a hamburg in Hamburg—in Pinckney, or even near Gregory. Cost is \$86 a night, plus your recreation passport admission to the rec area.

Other parks have everything from group cabins for up to 20—perfect for a small reunion—to yurts, which are circular tent or hard-side buildings. Some even offer rental pop-up campers. You provide the fun. For more information on these easy ways to camp without camping, search on your computer for Michigan state park cabin camping.

-- Seeking an uncommon travel experience? The Tawas Point Lighthouse Keeper Program offers the opportunity for a free two-week stay in historic lighthouse keepers' quarters while helping to promote the history and preservation of the site. The application period to participate in the program this year is now open.

The program offers combined vacation and service opportunities for adults from May 16 to Oct. 16. If you're selected to be volunteer lighthouse keepers, you'll get lodging in the restored keepers' quarters next to the 1876 Tawas Point Lighthouse in Tawas Point State Park. That's along Lake Huron north of Bay City, about 2-1/2 hours from your condo, if you don't know. In exchange, you'll do roughly 35 hours of services each week in and around the historic lighthouse that attracts visitors from all over the world.

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
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


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
