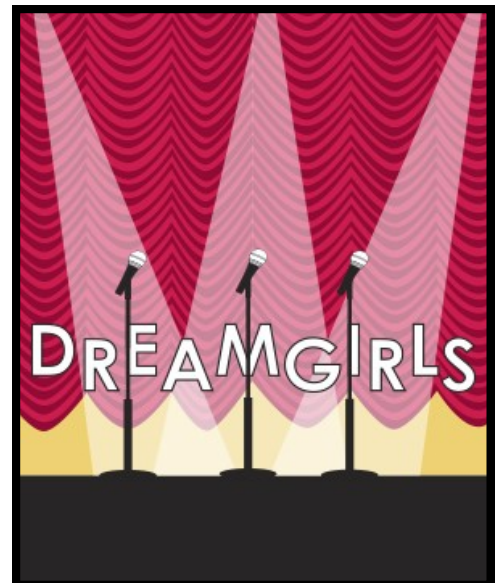

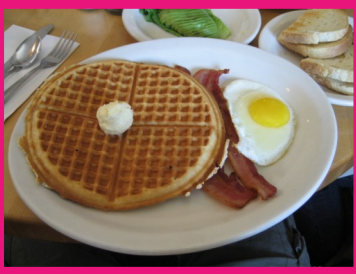

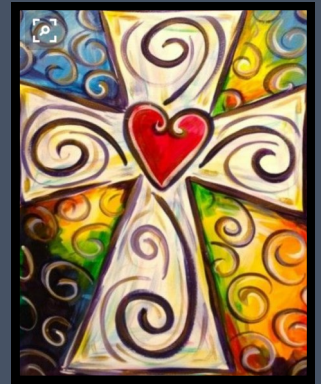

## Family Promise Host Week #3

Our third, (yes, it's already been our third!), Family Promise Host Week was held Dec 2-9<sup>th</sup>. During this week we had the opportunity to host four families, 6 adults and 7 children ages 1-15. With the help of our Set-Up Team, our Sunday School classrooms were quickly converted into guest rooms. Name cards were made, blankets were donated, meals and van routes were planned. Our Dinner Cooks prepared and served hot meals every evening, Overnight Hosts spent the nights here; Van Drivers drove the kids to their schools in the morning and picked the families up every evening.

We had over 60 volunteers on our team this week from St. Stephen and from our two supporting churches, Tallmadge First Congregational and First Christian Church in Stow. Just to highlight a few things that took place during the week; Lindsey Slater and her kids brought in games and made a hot chocolate bar to enjoy on Monday. On Tuesday, Valerie Huddleston and our Youth Group watched a movie and popped popcorn. We celebrated the Advent season together on Wednesday with Kim Fulton making Christmas cookies with the kids and Christmas trees with the families to take with them to their new homes. Sharon Ohnmeiss led crafts making Christmas cards and candy canes. Friday night Nancy Brown and students from Campus Lutheran Ministries in Kent were here to prepare dinner and visit with everyone. The guys from Men in Mission arrived early on Saturday morning to cook up a hot breakfast. What an awesome week!

Here's the good news: three of the families that stayed with us secured permanent housing during or just after our host week and the fourth family was scheduled to have moved into their new home before Christmas.

I'd like to share the following 2018 Family Promise Program success numbers:

30 Families served: 57 children, 45 adults  
3,634 Nights of shelter provided  
10,902 Meals provided  
Average length of stay in the program is 37 days

# Interim Pastor Training Report

## **Northeastern Ohio Synod; NALIP; St. Stephen, Stow Advance Interim Ministry Training:**

Fifteen pastors completed introductory Phase III intentional interim ministry training November 5-9 at St. Stephen, Stow. This third annual training was provided by the National Association of Lutheran Interim Pastors (NALIP) and sponsored by the Northeastern Ohio Synod, with the gracious hosting of St. Stephen, Stow. Recruiting and planning is underway for the fourth annual introductory intentional interim ministry training event, which will be offered at St. Stephen, Stow March 18-22, 2019 and November 4-8, 2019.

Moreover, due to three successful training cycles with the Northeastern Ohio Synod, the ELCA Churchwide organization and NALIP have invited the Northeastern Ohio Synod to host NALIP's advanced "After Pastor" interim ministry training course, August 12-14, 2019, which includes plans for a trainer from ELCA Churchwide.

Our synod's ongoing goal as a regional training center is to offer this training as an ecumenical opportunity to the Northeastern Ohio Synod and the wider Church, so that congregations and rostered ministers utilize interim transitional periods for intentional re-tooling and refocusing for future mission.

Since April 2016, 39 pastors have completed intentional interim ministry training in the Northeastern Ohio Synod: 18 NEOS; 14 non-NEOS ELCA representing six synods; 7 non-ELCA, including 1 Moravian and 6 Lutheran Church Missouri Synod. The non-NEOS ELCA and non-ELCA pastors represent six states in addition to Ohio: Indiana, Michigan, New Jersey, North Carolina, Pennsylvania, and Washington.
