

BRISBANE BOX

Native to Australia, this evergreen in the Myrtle family can reach 150 feet in height with showy bark. It is a drought-resistant shade tree with lance-shaped leaves that are 3 to 5 inches long, and produces small white flowers. Branches are mostly upright and do not droop.



CATALINA IRONWOOD

Native to the Channel Islands off the Central Coast of California, this moderate growth rate evergreen tree reaches 25 feet high in Santa Maria. This rare tree is known for its distinctive fern like leaf and peeling bark. It has small white flowers that bloom in early summer.



CHINESE ELM

This semi deciduous tree with leaves that thin out in the winter, is from Asia as the name implies. The Chinese Elm is a fast-growing large tree that will provide a lot of shade. The bark on this tree has an interesting mottling.



CHINESE PISTACHE

This deciduous tree is native to China and has slow to moderate growth up to 60 feet tall with nearly an equal spread. Older trees become dense and shapely. The foliage exhibits beautiful autumn colors even in mild climates: scarlet, crimson, orange and yellow. It has divi ded leaves with 10 to 16 paired leaflets that are 2 to 4 inches long.

COASTAL LIVE OAK (PIONEER PARK ONLY)

This oak is native to this coastal area. It is an evergreen tree that reaches 20 to 70 feet in height, often with a greater canopy spread. It has smooth, dark gray bark with dense foliage of rounded holly-like leaves that create a handsome shade tree. It is considered to be a moderate to fast growing tree.



CRAPE MYRTLE

This tree is a hybrid that likes warm summers, and it loses its leaves in the winter. Showy summer blooms in white, pinks, lavenders, and reds with good fall color. They range from 10 to 20 feet high and have distinctive smooth, flued bark.



EASTERN REDBUD

This sturdy tree is native to the United States grows 10 to 20 feet in height and spreads slightly wider. It flowers in spring with light to vibrant pink petals a half inch long for 2 to 3 weeks, attracting bees and butterflies. Its deciduous dark green leaves (3 to 5 inches across, often wider than long) turn a distinct yellow in the fall. Grows well in full sun to light shade.



EVERGREEN PEAR

This tree native to Taiwan is an evergreen that grows to 25 feet tall. The leaves are classic Pear leaves that are glossy. Large masses of flowers in late winter. Known for its distinctive 'old' bark, these trees imply age and dignity when planted in a focal area.



STRAWBERRY MADRONE TREE

This evergreen tree is a hybrid that closely resembles the California Madrone. It has slow to moderate growth up to 35 feet tall with equal spread. The trunk and branches have rich red-brown, shredding bark that become twisted and gnarled with age. It has clusters of small white urn-shaped flowers and fruit that resemble strawberries.
