Pastor's Study Desk Notes



Dear St Anthony & St Pius Families,

13th Sunday Ordinary Time Year A

Matthew 10:37-42

Love starts at home (Of course). And we know God's commands about honoring parents and family fidelity based on the fact that our parents gave us life (we come from them). But Jesus reminds us today that they came from God! God first gave life to them and then gave them life to give life on to us! God is behind it all. So, all of us, (parents and children), know that God is our common source. God above all, is to be acknowledged and served. Don't we remember the old catechism questions? Who made you? God. Why were you made? To know, love and serve God!

Jesus challenges us to examine our loves (Did you think I mistakenly wrote 'loves' instead of 'lives' there?) No, what we love, we also live for, so we should examine our loves. Who and what do you love? Who or what do you love above everything else (Jesus had already said that how we live, exposes what we treasure (Matt 6:21 "For where your treasure is, there also will your heart be.)

So, let us inventory our loves. What is at the top of the list? What or who do we love above everything else? Jesus tells us that God must top the list. Moses taught a ranking within the Ten Commandments, with 'Honoring Father and Mother' coming as the Fourth command. Notice the three preceding commands were about proper relation to God: First 1) One God, 2) Holy is His Name 3) Holy is God's Day (three commands like honoring the three Persons of the Trinity). Later, Jesus will summarize the ten commandments to simply two, Love God & Love your Neighbor as yourself. Jesus is revealing the proper ordering of our loves: First, we are to Love God, then secondly, Love our Neighbor (no can be closer neighbor than starting with father/mother) and then thirdly we Love our Self.

This absolute statement of God's priority over everything, even family loyalty, may surprise us. Yet, Jesus is saying that if I love anything or anyone more than God, then I have made that person /thing a God to me (What we call Idolatry- I'd be worshipping them, not God). So, before we jump to the conclusion that Jesus would have us think less of anyone because of our belief in God, we must keep in mind that God made us all! I didn't create them, God did, and so who can love them best, but God alone? God knows that any excuse we may give to justify loving someone else, more than God, is only our selfishness. It would be selfish because it would be like us saying to God, "I know better than You, how to love them!" I even feel like it would be hurting that other person, too, if I loved them more than God. My misguided love would be so much less than what God has for them! (I would be getting in the way of God's will of love for them). My stubborn loyalty to them impede the work of God blessing them through means other than me. This is something for us all to pray about when it comes to human love!

At one point (maybe more than once!) in ministry with Jesus, Peter throws in a comment toward Jesus, wondering if maybe he (Peter) should go back home with his family instead of persevering on mission with Jesus. In Matthew 19:27 "Peter said to Jesus, "We have given up everything and followed you. What will there be for us?" Jesus then goes on to answer Peter in Matt 19:29 "everyone who has given up houses or brothers or sisters or father or mother or children or lands for the sake of my name will receive a hundred times more, and will inherit eternal life." I hear Jesus telling Peter that He will take care of His apostles on mission with Him, and that would include taking care of their concerns. If they fear leaving or letting go of something/someone to go on His mission, Jesus assures them that their concern is important to Him too, and that they need to trust His care and provision for such needs. We find an example of this when Jesus calls James and John away from their work fishing with their father. Mark1:19-20 tells us that "James, the son of Zebedee, and his brother John were in a boat mending their nets. Then Jesus called them. So, they left their father Zebedee in the boat along with the hired men and followed him." Mark gives us the important detail that there are other hired men available to remain and help Zebedee. At another time, we hear of Jesus learning from the apostles about Peter's mother-in-law being sick in bed. Jesus knows such a family illness may hinder Peter from ministry or preoccupy the apostles' attention, so Jesus resolves this concern of theirs by immediately healing her (Mark 1:30-31) And Jesus gains another fellow servant for the Kingdom with the cure (verse 31 says she began to wait on & serve them!) When we do what Jesus calls us to do, we have to trust that He is aware of our heart's concerns (whatever we leave behind for Him) and that He will provide for them, in our absence. So, if we answer God 's call and start by Loving God first, then all of our loves will be properly ordered and properly taken care by His Will and His Provision. Peace and Prayers, Fr Brian
