WHAT'S THAT BOX?

Potted plants may be placed on graves 5 days before to 5 days after Easter Sunday and Memorial Day only. Christmas wreaths and grave blankets may be placed

on graves December 1st through January 5th only.

Permanent plantings, statues, battery or solar-powered items, balloons, breakable objects, and other commemorative items are not permitted at any time.

The Department of Veterans Affairs does not permit adornments that are offensive, inconsistent with the dignity of the cemetery or may be a safety hazard.

On the first and third Wednesday of each month, cemetery personnel will inspect each grave for unsightly or

Durable items removed from graves will be held for one month. These items remain property of the donor but are under custodianship of the cemetery. If not


