This is the time when we all are called to show our unconditional support for our fellow brothers and sisters.

We are strong in spirit and always committed to upholding justice despite the fact that the world has mostly adopted a stance of apathy. In these most trying times, it is of high urgency to show our solidarity in unity and respond to the challenge which presently shatters the peaceful lives of our compatriots.

To quote our Vehapar, His Holiness Karekin II, the Catholicos of All Armenians, nothing can deter us, for we are dignified people in seeking peace.

Justice shall prevail and the message of truth must be delivered loud and clear. Therefore, it is our expectation that the Diocesan communities take necessary actions in reaching out to governmental officials and ecumenical leaders to stand in defense of Armenia, thus in defense of justice.

For the last 200 years, the journey of our people has been the journey of the Cross. We pray to the Almighty God for His divine guidance, for the peace of the world, and for the prosperity of our Motherland.


ARMENIAN FOOD FESTIVAL


SISTER CHURCHES LUNCHEON

Richard Hagopian Inducted into Local Hall of Fame

Richard Hagopian was again honored for his amazing musical talent by being inducted into the VALLEY MUSIC HALL OF FAME. The Hall of Fame has been working, since 2017, to memorialize the contributions of those in the Central Valley music scene. Richard's acceptance into the Hall of fame was announced at an event last month and the official presentation ceremony was held on Sept. 21st at Roger Rocka's Dinner Theater in Fresno's Tower District.

Richard was given the title "Oudi" in 1969 by the internationally famous virtuoso Oudi Hrant, a blind master. This is the highest honor an oudist can receive. Additionally, Richard was a National Heritage Fellow in 1989. He is regarded as "one of America's most accomplished folk musicians" (according to a New York Times critic) and one of the most renowned Oud players in the world.

Richard began performing traditional Armenian music somewhere between the ages of 9 and 13 and became a sort of collector and library of Armenian music, learning more than 1,500 traditional folk songs. Not only has Richard passed on this heritage to his sons and grandsons, but he is known for passing on that same heritage as a performer and master-class instructor at places like the Manhattan School of Music and Fresno State, where he served as Artist in Residence.

WHAT'S GOING TO HAPPEN TO THOSE PEOPLE IN THE WORLD WHO HAVE NEVER HEARD ABOUT JESUS CHRIST?

You may have heard this question put this way: "What about the person living in the jungle somewhere who's never heard the good news about Jesus Christ? Are you Christians saying that a person won't go to heaven based solely on where he lives?"

No, we're not saying that. The Bible tells us that God doesn't work that way. We understand that God is perfect in his love and perfect in his holiness and he's perfectly just and fair. Therefore, it's against God's nature to be unfair. It's against God's nature to hide the ball on salvation or to condemn somebody who's ignorant of his truth. In fact, the Bible declares that God is loving and patient and not willing that anybody should perish. He wants everybody to come to repentance and to come to know him.

If God is a perfectly loving and righteous God, then he will figure out ways to help people understand him. He somehow reveals the simple truth of the gospel to people throughout the world. You know, I've talked to people who were missionaries in Africa who've told me that Jesus has revealed himself through nature. When you look at nature you learn that God is organized, that God is creative, that God likes variety. But it's when we look at Jesus Christ, we realize that God is loving.

And as Christians we are called to tell the good news to other people. It's God's decision to decide what happens to people who haven't heard about him. But it is our decision to take that news to as many people as possible. And the Bible says we will be held more responsible because we have heard and we have known that God is love, that God wants a relationship to us and that God will forgive us if we give our lives to Jesus Christ.

So, what do we do about those who haven't heard? We tell them. First, we accept God's good news and then we tell people about it. Then, we leave the result in the hands of a fair, loving, and just God.
