Enough Said About Noise

am speaking about motorcycle exhaust noise, "Loud Pipes", "Rolling Thunder", or any of several other ways to describe loud motorcycles. I do not really want to get into a debate as to the legal aspects of loud pipes as it pertains to Florida Law. But, it is my responsibility just to give you accurate legal safety information. What you do with it is up to you. So just as a reminder, or something new to some, FSS 316.293(5)(b) states that the exhaust system of any motor vehicle (which includes motorcycles) is not to be modified to be any louder than how it was originally manufactured. As you can see, that would include most of the modifications a lot of motorcyclists do to their bikes. A decibel meter is not required for proof under that statute.

So why do I bring up this subject? It isn't the noise I question. It is the reasoning some have behind the noise.

"Loud Pipes Saves Lives" is a statement often heard to justify the noise. This statement is totally untrue and that attitude might actually contribute to a crash. If you are properly trained for riding a motorcycle, you must learn to ride as if you are invisible to survive. You are taught to look ahead (and behind), plan ahead, formulate a strategy in case some car violates your right-of-way. Have possible escape paths in mind should a car move into you space. Choose a lane position to make sure you are being seen the best by approaching cars.

The problem with the "Loud Pipes Saves Lives Mentality" is that those riders think because they are making all that noise. approaching cars will part for them like Moses parting the Red Sea. Therefore, they do none of the defensive strategies I had previous described. As a retired Motorcycle Crash Investigator, I can testify to the fact that I probably saw more motorcycle with loud pipes go down than quiet motorcycles. The riders of the quiet motorcycle are using safe riding practices for protection. Extra lights up front, bright clothing, and a set of loud horns would be of more benefit. All that noise from a loud exhaust system is pointing behind you. The cars that we are most likely to collide are approaching from the opposite

direction which usually turn left in front of you at an intersection. Their windows are up, the A/C is on, there stereo is playing or they are talking on the phone. They do not hear all your glorious noise. Some riders often say "Yea, but when I am making all that noise no one will change lanes into me". That sounds good, but can you back it with statistics? The answer is there no statistics to support that statement. Very few motorcycles get hit by cars changing lanes into them. Maybe the rest of the guys with the quiet pipes learned how to anticipate a possible improper lane change and learned how to swerve to avoid getting hit. Maybe a set of extra loud horns would serve you much better than a set of loud pipes. Most stock motorcycle horns are inadequate. After market horns are easily available. I recommend at least a pair of 110 decibel horns. I have a set of 130 decibel horns on my motorcycle.

Let me give you an example of what I am talking about as to the effect of loud exhaust. I often go to the MacDill Air Force Base Air Fest. During the Blue Angels air show one of the tricks they like to play on you is for you to focus on 5 jets flying in front of you. The 6th jet had peeled off and circled around behind the crowd. The

approaching single jet flies low and suddenly passes over the crowd's heads startling all of them. No one heard it coming.

I think that F18 is a little louder than a motorcycle, yet no one heard it until it passed. I think you get the point.

So, in conclusion: Make all the noise you want. That is

National Cupcake Day

Each year, December 15th also recognizes National Cupcake Day. The cupcake was originally known as the 1-2-3-4 cake because the recipe called for 1 cup of butter, 2 cups of sugar, 3 cups of flour, 4 eggs, and also 1 cup of milk, and 1 spoonful of baking soda. Even the word cupcake sounds like a miniature celebration. They've been known by other phrases that make us put our hands together in glee, too!

Someone must have wanted to surprise a loved one with a sweet, single-serving treat when they invented the cupcake. One of the first recipes for a cupcake can be traced back to 1796. A recipe notation for a cake to be baked in small cups was written in American Cookery (by Amelia Simmons). Don't you wonder if she made them for her children or grandchildren?

The earliest known documentation of the term cupcake shows up in 1828 in Seventy-five Receipts for Pastry, Cakes, and Sweetmeats. The cookbook was by Eliza Leslie. Maybe she just liked individual servings.

Bakers originally baked cupcakes in heavy pottery cups. Today, some bakers still use individual ramekins, small coffee mugs, larger teacups, or other small ovenproof pottery-type dishes for baking their cupcakes. They do make a beautiful presentation for these miniature cakes.

Merry Christmas!

Go ahead, it's Christmas season. Splurge for that important safety "upgrade" (read toy?) for your (or your co-rider's) bike/trike or riding gear! How about:

New helmet? Helmet effectiveness decreases over time. Helmet manufacturers generally recommend a maximum full-strength life span of around 5-6 years assuming the helmet has not been dropped/damaged and the inside padding is still intact.

Modulating headlight, taillight, brake light or helmet mounted brake light? Studies have shown that modulating head/tail/brake light is the number one method to increase a bike's conspicuity.

Low-mounted, fog/riding

lights (and keep them on)? Studies have shown that lowmounted lights are more conspicuous than other mounting locations.

New tires? Not very Christmassy (is that a word?), but very important.

Tire pressure monitoring system? If you don't have one

built in, it is a very convenient and safety-improving gadget.

New armored shirt or jacket? If heat is an issue for you, then very lightweight and cool mesh armored shirts are available. Also consider one of the new, lightweight, airbag vests or jackets. Airbag vests deployment systems are available with electronic Gsensors or the good ole fashion rip cord that must be hooked/ unhooked to the bike with each mount/dismount.
