Dominican Republic Community Partnerships

Following the success of our Missions & Outreach program in 2013, we began to recognize the great potential of our program to create long-term change if we concentrated our efforts on partnering with carefully chosen communities. For the next few years, both our students and visiting mission teams will work to build strong relationships with the communities of El Callejon and Majaquita in partnership with Dominican natives who have a desire and a vision to see these communities succeed.

Majaguita

Majaguita is a small community comprised of approximately 150 people who are working together to be self-sustaining.

We believe that to be effective in serving others, we must serve those who already have a personal desire and drive to sustain our efforts. Our goal is to come alongside the people of Majaguita to help them implement their vision for improving the community. They have proven their desire to be self-sustainable

The village is led by a man named Julito who is not only the mayor, but also the spiritual leader. Julito is a servant-leader who works tirelessly to provide daily necessities for the people in his community such as food, clean drinking water, electricity, and even gas for cooking. All of this is done in a way that uses the natural resources of the community.

El Callejon

El Callejon is a community made up of roughly 100 families. Crosswinds has begun building strong relationships with two couples who have taken leadership roles in the community.

The first, a young couple named Rudy and Yajaira, have

persevered through the personal loss of two children to start a school called "Los Chiquitines" for children ages 5-12 in the community. Their dream is to provide K-12 education in the years to come.

The second is couple named Reynaldo and Lourdes. After struggling with alcoholism and depression for many years, Reynaldo and Lourdes both gave their lives to Christ and have committed themselves to serving Him and serving others. Reynaldo now provides jobs to men in the community by hiring them to load plants onto his truck, which he then delivers to different cities. As they work together, he shares with them how Jesus changed his life. His dream is to grow his business, allowing him to employ even more men from the community.

a situation has been, sometimes the idea of going to a support group or counseling office seems like it will only add more stress to an already stressful situation.

With Crosswinds In-Home Family programming, all of this stress is avoided as our therapists visit our client's home in person.



Family Counseling

Our family counseling program provides in-home therapy to families facing issues such as marital strife, grief, teenage rebellion and more. Each family in our care meets regularly with a Crosswinds therapist, either in-person or online via our e-counseling sessions.

E-counseling is ideal for families who live outside of the state of Indiana, or for families with members living in different locations. For example, if a family is undergoing therapy for their teenage son but the mother lives in Texas and the father lives in Florida, both can still participate in the virtual family counseling sessions with their son.

Family Coaching



Crosswinds also offers a Family Coaching program for families who don't see themselves quite at the point of needing counseling, but feel they could use a "tune-up" in areas like communication or supporting one another.

Family Coaching begins with an evaluation of the areas in which the family is doing well and the areas in which they need improvement. Our Family Coaches then work with the family to give them tools to improve the areas that need some work.
