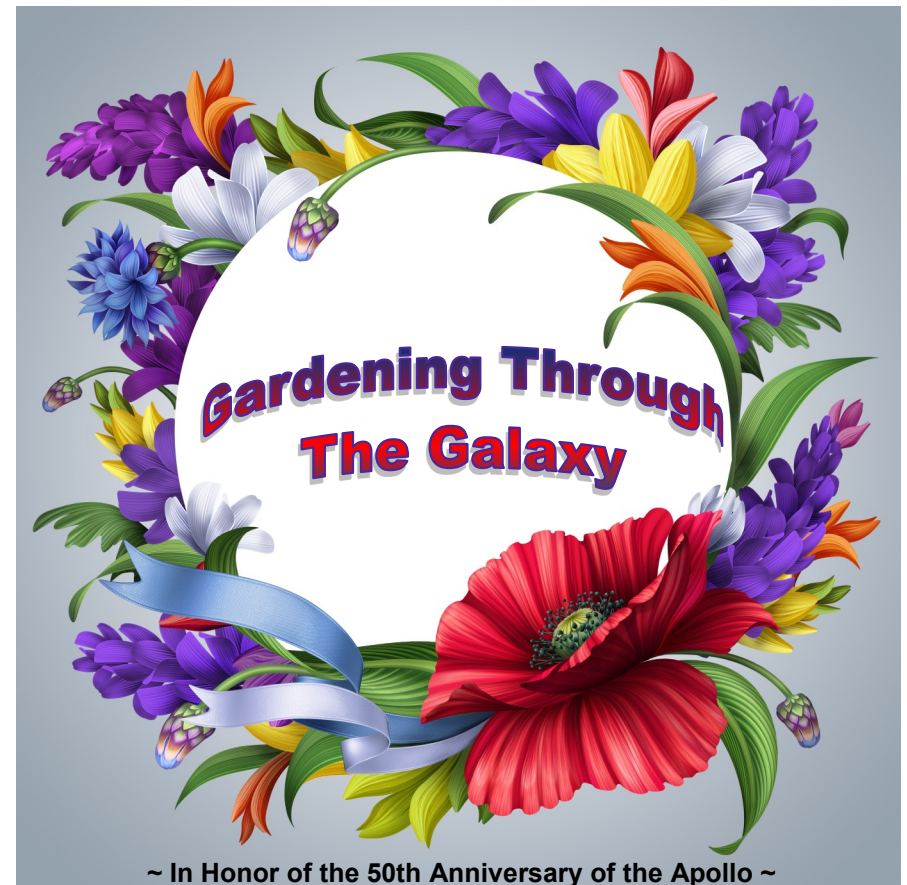

I. Designs

Plant material used in designs does not have to be grown by the exhibitor. Accessories and bases may be used at any time. Only one entry allowed in each class per exhibitor. All designs must contain fresh or dry plant material. "Fresh" as used below means the majority of materials used will be fresh. Artificial plant material is not allowed. Designers have complete freedom of style in all designs.

Creativity is used to express the title of each class.

Space is limited - maximum space available for each design 20"wx20"d.

1. The Milky Way

A dry arrangement with spirals

2. Jupiter

A large design featuring the delphinium, our city flower, and/or the peony, our borough flower

3. Sun

Fresh flowers of yellow, red and orange make this design a "sunny" tribute

4. Earth

A fresh arrangement containing a water element

5. Comet

A predominantly white fresh floral design with a tail

6. Black Hole

A black container is the base for this fresh arrangement

7. Venus vs. Mars

Two containers are used in this fresh design to include a vegetable(s)

8. Asteroid Belt

Rocks are integrated into this fresh floral creation

9. Saturn

Fresh floral design featuring a ring(s)

10. Big Dipper - NOVICE

The Alaska Flag is featured in this fresh floral arrangement
Open to a designer who has never won a blue ribbon in a design class

11. Moon - Youth (18 Years or Younger)

Fresh floral design featuring a rocket

12. Pluto

Fresh flowers make up this petite design, not to exceed 8 inches in any direction

II. Horticulture



All plant material must be fresh and grown by Exhibitor. Only one entry in each flower type and size per exhibitor. Under "Not Listed" - any # of entries allowed, but only 1 per flower type and size. Containers should be clear, preferably colorless glass bottles, provided by the Exhibitor.
